We believe, that with God, everything is in our reach.

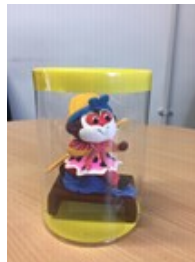
Dear Parent / Carer
