

OCTOBER NEWSLETTER St Giles Junior School

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We hope everyone is well.

The children have really settled in well into their classes this half term and the teachers have had the time to monitor and assess every child's learning.

Baseline assessments have now been completed in reading, writing and maths for all year groups. The teaching is therefore targeted to support the pupils from their starting points this term. Some pupils may have lost learning due to the lockdown period and it is important that we enable pupils to learn and consolidate key learning skills in order to make good progress in reading, writing and maths.

We are also ensuring that the wellbeing of the pupils remains a top priority and are giving them opportunities to discuss their feelings and promoting a positive attitude in the school. Specific interventions are in place to support identified pupils and help them further with their learning.

The plans put into place for when a 'bubble' has to self-isolate have unfortunately been tested out already. Well done to Year 4/5 who have carried on with their learning online, it was good to see so many of your carrying on despite being at home – thanks to parents/carer as well for all your support.

The reason for Year 4/5 not being in school highlights the fact that we are in a pandemic. It is quite easy to sit and watch the news and feel that it is happening to someone else, but now the risk that Covid brings seems very real. If you, your child or someone in close contact with your family is experiencing symptoms.

- Self isolate and do NOT send your child to school.
- Get a test and wait for the results.
- Do NOT let your child return to school if they have been in close contact with anyone displaying the symptoms.
- Keep the school office updated at every stage.

<u>**31**st OCTOBER 2020</u> – closing date for applications 1st March 2021 – National offer day 12th March 2021 – deadline for accepting offers 29th March 2021 – deadline for submitting appeals May/June 2021 – appeal hearings

Most schools will have a transition team in place who would be more than happy to answer any questions that you have, and we suggest that you contact them and discuss your child's.
