

Vocabulary dozen

Bay	<i>an indentation of a shoreline. Usually of softer rock</i>
Beach	<i>a landform by the sea. usually sand and/or rock</i>
Cliff	<i>a vertical or near vertical rock feature, usually on the coast</i>
Coral	<i>marine invertebrates that typically live in compact colonies in the sea</i>
Dock	<i>a structure for handling boats and ships and their cargo</i>
Dune	<i>a hill or ridge made from sand, formed by the wind</i>
Erosion	<i>a process where the surface of the earth is worn away by, e.g. water, wind, waves etc</i>
Estuary	<i>where the mouth of a river broadens as it meets the sea</i>
Harbour	<i>a sheltered port where boats can dock</i>
Pier	<i>a structure built on posts that extends out to sea</i>
Promenade	<i>a public walk by the seaside</i>
Tourism	<i>a worldwide industry based on travel for leisure, pleasure, business, and other reasons that provides information, amenities, attractions, accommodation etc.</i>
