Science


We will be exploring seasonal changes this term, and throughout the year and we will be studying plants with a particular focus on trees.

Following our theme of foxes, we will look at different types of foxes, their habitats and simple food chains.

Computing

Children will be developing confidence and working more independently. They will be using technology (laptops, computers and iPads) purposefully to create, organise and store content, through the use of programs such as Word, Publisher, Dazzle, Colour Magic and much more.

I will send home website addresses and useful apps that we use in the classroom to aid learning.



Geography

We will be learning about our local area, and we will carry out simple field studies looking at Wheatley Hill and its features.

History topic: Christmas in the past

We will not start to engage in this topic until mid-November when we will look at Christmas in the past and how was Christmas different for our parents? We will also briefly look at Remembrance Day and why it is important.

Maths

Your child will cover all aspects of maths each term. We are currently focussing on numbers to 20, counting forwards and backwards and saying what is one more and one less. We are also looking number patterns and number sequences.

We then move onto addition and subtraction.

When maths homework is given out, it usually has an example or a little explanation for you, so that you know what is expected of your child and what we have been doing in class.

Homework

- I can't stress enough the value of you listening to your child read at home. Your child is of the age where reading at home is essential.
 - Please can you record in the reading record book when you have listened to your child read. This helps us when changing your child's books.
- Homework will generally be given out on a Friday evening and I usually ask for it
 to be returned on Wednesday of the following week. I hope that this enables all
 pupils to have the opportunity to work with their parents and carers.
 - Children are immediately rewarded an achievement point for completing their homework and returning it to school.

PE Monday & Thursday

All pupils now have a PE kit in school, so thank you for your support.

We continue to encourage independence when getting ready for PE, so please may I request that you consider what your child is wearing on Mondays and Thursdays. Some children struggle with pinafores and buttons.
