The children will work on building strong structures and will relate this to buildings made in Roman times. They will also make some food based on those eaten by the Romans.


REMINDERS

ENGLISH ACTIVITIES

Writing

During this term the children will be building on the skills of Year 2 including using capital letters and a range of punctuation. In addition they will be:

- Learning to use a wider range of conjunctions
- Starting to organise writing into paragraphs
- Using commas and apostrophes
- Writing for different purposes

And learning a wider range of spelling patterns and tricky words.

Reading

The children will be given opportunities to read every day. This maybe individually, in a group or as a whole class.

They will also be:

- Researching information about Roald Dahl and his books
- Reading non-fiction texts about the Romans
- Learning to read more speedily
- Understanding what has been read and being able to discuss it
- Predicting what might happen next.

MATHEMATICS ACTIVITIES

This year, the children will be taught Maths using a 'Mastery' approach. Through this, they develop a much better understanding and learn to solve mathematical problems.


They will practise times tables and mental skills every day. Other Maths activities will include:

SCIENCE
