60 Seconds



Need: Cubes, 1-6 dice

- Working in small groups, each child takes turns to throw the dice.
- They multiply the number on the dice by five and write down that number of seconds.
 For example, roll a 3, write down 15 seconds because 5 x 3 = 15.
- Each time a child rolls the dice they multiply the dice number by five and add that amount of seconds to their total. If a child makes a total of 60 seconds or above they have crossed the minute boundary and take a cube. They subtract 60 seconds from their total and play continues.
 - For example, total of 75. Take a cube to represent a minute and subtract 60 seconds from the total to leave 15 seconds.
- The winner is the first child to collect 5 minutes.
