Science: Floating and Sinking

Challenge:

Gather a collection of objects in your house and see what floats or sinks? What would make a good boat?



Practice basic maths:

Can you recognise some numerals of personal significance.

Can you recognise numerals 1 to 10?

Can you count up to three or four objects by saying one number name for each item?

Can you count out up to six objects from a larger group?

Selects the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 10 objects.

Can you use the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects?

Can you find the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them?

Can you say the number that is one more than a given number?

Go on a shape hunt in your home and garden and see what shapes you can find.

RE: Lent is a season to change

Find out about the events of Palm Sunday, The Last Supper, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Draw pictures to retell some of these stories.

Design and make:

Make a plan for a farm. What animals would you have? What vehicles would you need? Next, make your farm out of junk modelling.



Art:

Can you use a range of materials to make a Spring Collage? What are the colours of Spring? What could you use?

Writing

Don't forget to practice writing the letters – s, m, a, d, t! When drawing a picture, you can ask your child to sound out the words to tell about the picture.

Your child could try writing some of the sound of the things they have drawn.
