Try following the below instructions to make a pirate hat.

Create a boat using junk modelling materials. Can you design a flag for you boat? What will you call your boat?

Challenge – Which materials are waterproof and allow the boat to float without getting wet and soggy?



Maths

Collect two bowls and a selection of objects. Place a few objects in each bowl and count them. How many do you have altogether? Can you write the correct numbers? Try writing this as a number sentence for your child and introduce the addition symbol. Can they complete the number sentence?





Have a mini picnic or tea party and introduce basic vocabulary relating to sharing. You could use a cake, sandwich, pie or pizza to do this. Talk about what you are doing as you carry out the action e.g cutting a cake or sandwich into half or quarters.

Fireworks in a Glass

Science Experiment



- To start with, make sure your glass is clean.
- Pour the warm water into the glass until about ³/₄ full.
- In the other glass, add a few spoonfuls of oil and 4 drops of food colouring.
- 4. Add some different colours to the oil.
- Using the fork, mix together the oil and food colouring, to spread the colours throughout the oil.
- Finally, pour the coloured oil into the glass of warm water and watch for the 'firework' display to start.

You will need:

Food colouring (various colours)

Warm water

Oil

2 empty glasses

Fork

Science Experiment

Method

- Decide on the 2 colours you want to mix and fill 2 glasses, each with a different coloured water.
- Cut a piece of kitchen roll in half, then fold it into quarters lengthwise so you end up with one long thin strip of kitchen roll.
- Put one end of the kitchen roll into one glass of coloured water and the other end into the empty glass.
- 4. Prepare another piece of kitchen roll and place the end of that one in your other glass of coloured water, with the other end in the same empty glass as the first piece of kitchen roll.
- The water from both glasses 'walks' up the paper towels into the empty jar and stops when the level of water in all 3 glasses is equal.
- The empty glass will now be a combination of the 2 other glasses, so is excellent for colour mixing activities.
- Repeat with different primary colours. You could even try with all 3 primary colours into the same glass.

You will need:

Empty glasses

Water

Food colouring: red, yellow and blue

Kitchen roll


Minibeast Hun







How to Make a Pirate Hat

1 Use a large rectangular piece of 2 Fold the paper in half. paper or newspaper.







3 Fold over the top corners so they meet in the middle.



4 Lift up the front flap at the bottom and fold.




5 Flip the paper over and repeat.

Cheese and Apple Pirate Ships

Ingredients

6 red or green eating apples 250g cheddar cheese

Equipment

Knife

Cocktail sticks

Apple corer or apple slicer

Plain paper

Felt-tip pens

Scissors

Glue or sticky tape

Method

- 1. Wash and core the apples.
- 2. Cut the apples into quarters using a sharp knife. Take care when you are cutting the apples, ask an adult for help if you need it.
- 3. Cut the cheese into small cubes.
- 4. Slide the cubes of cheese, one at a time, on to a cocktail stick. This will be the mast of the ship.
- 5. Stick the cocktail stick and cheese into the apple ship.
- 6. Cut a small rectangle of paper for the pirate's flag. Design and decorate your own flag and fold it in half around the top of the cocktail stick.
- 7. Your cheese and apple pirate ships are now ready to enjoy!
