Practice basic maths:

Can you recognise some numerals of personal significance.

Can you recognise numerals 1 to 10?

Can you count up to three or four objects by saying one number name for each item?

Can you count out up to six objects from a larger group?

Selects the correct numeral to represent 1 to 5, then 1 to 10 objects.

Can you estimate how many objects they can see and check by counting them.

Can you use the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare two sets of objects?

Can you find the total number of items in two groups by counting all of them?

Can you say the number that is one more than a given number.

Can you find one more or one less from a group of up to five objects, then ten objects?

Science: Floating and Sinking

Challenge:

Gather a collection of objects in your house and see what floats or sinks? What materials would make a good boat?



RE: Lent is a season to change

Find out about the events of Palm Sunday, The Last Supper, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Draw pictures and write a sentence to retell one of these stories.

Design and make:

Make a plan for a farm. What animals would you have? What vehicles would you need? Next, make your farm out of junk modelling.

Can you use a range of materials to make a Spring Collage? What are the colours of Spring? What could you use?
