

We know that Jesus is always with us and so we have the courage to pray together:


We pray for world leaders: that they may treat their people fairly and do all that they can to bring an end to poverty. Lord, in your mercy...



Ask the children to go home and tell their family all that they have heard and thought about today and to do all that they can in the coming week to show their faith in Jesus through their actions.











### We Listen to the Word of God:

A reading from the book of Exodus 24:3-8

Moses told the people all of the Lord's commands and laws.

The people answered, "We will do everything the Lord has commanded!"

Then Moses wrote down all that the Lord had said.

The next morning Moses got up early and built an altar at the foot of the mountain. He took a large stone for each of the twelve tribes of Israel and placed the stones there. Then he sent some young men to burn offerings and sacrifice bulls as special offerings to the Lord.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

It was the first day of the Feast of Thin Bread, and the Passover lambs were being killed.

Jesus' disciples asked him,

"Where do you want us to prepare the Passover meal?" Jesus said to two of the disciples,

"Go into the city,

where you will meet a man carrying a jar of water. Follow him, and when he goes into a house, say to the owner,

"Our teacher wants to know if you have a room where he can eat the Passover meal with his disciples."

The owner will take you upstairs and show you a large room furnished and ready for you to use.









Prepare the meal there." The two disciples went into the city and found everything just as Jesus had told them. So they prepared the Passover meal. During the meal Jesus took some bread in his hands. He blessed the bread and broke it. Then he gave it to his disciples and said, "Take this. It is my body." Jesus picked up a cup of wine and gave thanks to God. He then gave it to his disciples and said, "Drink it!" So they all drank some. Then he said, "This is my blood, which is poured out for many people, and with it God makes his agreement. From now on I will not drink any wine, until I drink new wine in God's kingdom."

### We Respond - We reflect on today's Gospel: Taken from www.adorers.org

Communion. Holy Communion. We are united, by the Spirit of Jesus in a COMMON UNION which helps us to be HOLY. Communion isn't just an action it is a statement of belief. We gather together, in a Common Union, in the Spirit, through which celebrate our belief that Jesus gave us his body and blood.

This feast of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) began in 1294. About the first 12 centuries Communion was given in both bread and wine. Even infants received the Precious Blood.

Beginning in the 12th century and continuing into the 13th, the practice of receiving the Precious Bloodbegan to be limited to the priest presider alone. Early in the 20th century, then especially during and after Vatican II, the practice was encouraged.

Most people take it for granted but in reality, it has only been in the last 30 years or so that Catholics have been able to receive in the hand and under both species!

The first reading, Moses talks about the blood of the covenant and uses it to sprinkle on the people. Today, we use holy water to bless the Assembly—good idea! The Bread which Jesus 'took, blest, broke and gave' to the disciples is a sign of the New Covenant.

### We Profess our faith in God together:

### We Respond

1. We think of God the Father, who gave us the Body and Blood of his Son Jesus. May we try to understand this gift more and more.

"Do this in memory of me.". May we think carefully about what we do during Mass, so that we are truly ready to be joined with Jesus in Communion.

3. We think of the children who are about to receive their First Holy Communion. May they continue to receive, helped by their parents, priests and teachers.

4. We pray for people who do not yet know that Jesus is the Bread of Life. May they soon learn that Jesus came to feed ALL mankind.








## Bread Of Life Crossword






