

He won't shout or yell or call out in the streets.


He won't quit or give up until he brings justice to all the earth,

In the Gospel today, we hear God the Father say: 'You are my Son whom I love. I am very pleased with you.' God the Father doesn't just say these words to Jesus, He says them to us as well! As you re-read the Gospel passage, add your name into the sentence said by God... 'You are..., my son or daughter whom I love. I am very pleased with you.'


Reflect on your own baptism today. Talk about this with your family. Why is a Baptism such a special moment in someone's life of faith?

We Profess our faith in God together:

I believe in God the Father, I believe in God the Son, I believe in God the Holy Spirit. Our God is three, Our God is One.

We Turn to the Lord in Prayer

We pause for a few moments and bring to mind the situations and people that we need to prayer for. We might share these aloud together... We now turn to Our Blessed Lady and ask her to take our prayers to her Son as we say: Hail Mary...



We Pray the Family Prayer of All Christians Our Father...

We now make an Act of Spiritual Communion My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all thing and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen

We end our time of prayer

May God Bless us and keep us safe. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

Activity suggestions


Invite your child to colour in the accompanying illustration and to write or draw on the back how they will try to live their lives as God wants them to in the coming week.

At our baptism we are given a name. You could spend time writing out their names on labels to wear, or simply calling their names out as a celebration of their unique place in God's family.

Create a big dove collage to represent the Holy Spirit and add on the things that the Holy Spirit brings to our lives both at the time of our baptism and beyond: courage, hope, joy, etc

Get out their baptismal candle after the liturgy, light it and to say a prayer together for all God's children - our family around the world. And remind them to try this week to live their lives as God wants us to - with kindness and generosity, as we try to make the world a better place for all to live.
