We gather together in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit Amen.


We turn to God asking for His guidance and strength in our lives.



"You are already clean because of what I have said to you. "Stay joined to me, and I will stay joined to you.

"I am the vine, and you are the branches.


If you stay joined to me, and I stay joined to you,

Being Connected to Jesus like the branches are connected to the vine

A good gardener needs to cut off old branches, trim the dead parts or the old parts that aren't giving life in order for more fruit and life to grow and flourish. The fruit that falls to the ground dies because it has no connection anymore to the life giving water and nutrients that the trunk brings.

Jesus says: "Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own and needs to stay connected to the tree, so it is the same with Jesus and us." When we remain connected to Jesus by prayer and the Eucharist, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and by loving others by treating others with care and respect in things we say and do, Jesus fills us with his life and nourishes us with His life-giving food. Then we will bear the fruit of Jesus. We will bring joy and happiness and peace to ourselves and others. We will be life-giving to others like Jesus is life-giving to us.

We Profess our faith in God together:

I believe in God the Father, I believe in God the Son, I believe in God the Holy Spirit. Our God is three, Our God is One.


We know that Jesus is the true vine always supporting us, his branches. Let us keep this in mind as we pray together:

Activity Ideas- From CAFOD

Ask the children to colour in the accompanying illustration. On the back ask them to write or draw what they think caring for the world and your neighbours means and the one thing they will do over the coming week to care for other people, especially those who are poor. Or ask them to write a prayer for all their brothers and sisters around the world who are having a hard life because of poverty.


Make sheep with the children - have the children decorate their cut-outs with cotton wool and felt tips. Have them write their name on the sheep and then stick them all on a big picture of the world, or if they are at home, they can go on the fridge or on a big piece of paper decorated like a field.

Ask the children to go home and share all they have heard and thought about today. If they have written a prayer ask them to say it together during the week and to do one thing this week to show their love for their global family.
