Amen.


We turn to God asking for His guidance and strength in our lives.

If you give it up in this world,


you will be given eternal life.

God's laws only make real sense when we understand them in our HEARTS. LOVE is the LAW God writes on our hearts—just like God wrote on the hearts of the people of the House of Israel. Just like the LAW Jesus came to fulfil. "God so loved the world..."


Jesus came to reveal the love, the heart of God, which is LOVE. When we really know someone, or someone really knows us, we say: "I know you by heart." Well, God knows us by heart!! Jesus is the only person that totally, totally, loved God from his heart. That's one reason we, as Catholic Christians, honour the Sacred Heart and the Precious Blood of Jesus.

Blood is the source of life. Blood is what is contained in the heart and gives a person life. Well, the LAW OF LOVE written on our hearts by God, gives us life. Jesus' love, poured out in love for all of Creation, gave us a share in the life of God. In the Gospel by John, today, Jesus tells the disciples, he knows the day, the hour, is coming for him to be lifted up. We know, that means, when Jesus is lifted up on the Cross. From the Cross, Jesus offered his Body and his Blood as a great sign of the love

In his heart! At Mass, when we watch the BREAD/HOST being lifted up, we believe, with all our heart, it is the Body of Jesus. When we watch the WINE/CHALICE being lifted up, we believe, with all our heart, it is the Blood of Jesus. In our hearts, we know God has the power to change ordinary bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus.

#### We Profess our faith in God together:

I believe in God the Father, I believe in God the Son, I believe in God the Holy Spirit. Our God is three, Our God is One.

You may want to ask the children to offer their own prayers or you can use the suggestions below.


We believe in Jesus the Son of God who died and rose again and so we pray together:

We pray for the poorest people in our world: that the seeds they plant may give a rich harvest so that they have enough to eat. Lord, in your mercy...

Closing prayer: Christ Jesus, fill us with your love and mercy and show us how to make a difference to the lives of our brothers and sisters around the world. Amen.



#### Activity Ideas- From CAFOD

Ask the children to colour in the accompanying illustration and on the back to draw anything they have given up this Lent to raise money to help people living in poverty.

Plant seeds with the children for them to look after to watch how they grow.

Do a mime. Get them to curl up tightly into a ball and pretend to be seeds - as you talk about rain and sunshine they start to grow until they are tall trees bearing fruit.

On flower-shaped pieces of card, copy the prayer below, based on the life of Archbishop Oscar Romero. Say it with the children and encourage them to say it together with their family during the next week.

This is what we are about:
We plant seeds that one day will grow.
We water seeds already planted,
knowing that they hold future promise.

Ask the children to tell their family all that they have heard and thought about today. Ask them to count how many things they eat this week that started off as a seed and when doing so to think about the story that they have heard today.
