We turn to God asking for His guidance and strength in our lives.





† A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark 1:21-28 Jesus and his disciples went to the town of Capernaum.




We pray for the sick, the sad and the lonely. May they feel the presence of God close to them.



### Activity Ideas from CAFOD

Invite the children to colour in the accompanying illustration of some girls at school in Bangladesh, and to write or draw on the back one way in which Jesus teaches us through his actions.

Encourage the children to think about their favourite teacher and to explain what it is they like about them. Perhaps they could pray for their teacher in the week.

Reflect with the children on all the help they get so that they can go to school, or on all the help that they get to learn at home. Where does their uniform come from? Their books? Who takes them to school? How do they get there? Who helps them with their work? Who explains things when they don't understand? Encourage them to write a prayer of thanks for being able to learn.

Encourage the children to share all that they have heard and thought about today with others at home. As they learn this week, ask them to think of Faizah and other children around the world. If they have written a prayer, ask them to say it at home with their families during the week.


