We gather together in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit Amen.


We turn to God asking for His guidance and strength in our lives.

This man is standing here completely well because of the power of Jesus Christ from Nazareth.


"You put Jesus to death on a cross, but God raised him to life.

they don't know who we are.


My dear friends, we are already God's children, though what we will be has not yet been seen. But we do know that when Christ returns, we will be like him,

sheep.


"Hired workers are not like the shepherd.

and I give up my life for my sheep.


"I have other sheep that are not in this sheep pen.



#### Activity Ideas - From CAFOD

Ask the children to colour in the accompanying illustration. On the back ask them to write or draw what they think caring for the world and your neighbours means and the one thing they will do over the coming week to care for other people, especially those who are poor. Or ask them to write a prayer for all their brothers and sisters around the world who are having a hard life because of poverty.

Make sheep with the children - have the children decorate their cut-outs with cotton wool and felt tips. Have them write their name on the sheep and then stick them all on a big picture of the world, or if they are at home, they can go on the fridge or on a big piece of paper decorated like a field.

Ask the children to go home and share all they have heard and thought about today. If they have written a prayer ask them to say it together during the week and to do one thing this week to show their love for their global family.








