We gather together in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit Amen.


We turn to God asking for His guidance and strength in our lives.

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit took control of everyone who was listening. Some Jewish followers of the Lord had come with Peter.


and they were surprised that the Holy Spirit had been given to Gentiles. Now they were hearing Gentiles speaking unknown languages and praising God.

'As the Father has loved me, so I love You

"As the Father has loved me, so I love you." Isn't that amazing?! Jesus loves us the way His Father loves Him! To find out just how much love that is we need to look at how God treated Jesus. God gave Him a mother and step-father that were very special and loving. God told everyone that Jesus was His son and He was very proud of Him. God guided Jesus to tell the world that God loves them and wants them to treat each other with love and respect. God asked Jesus to do things that were right even though others would get angry and not like Him. God asked Jesus to die to save us. God raised Jesus from the dead. Saying that Jesus loves us in the same way that God loves Him means that He also cares for us like a parent and asks us to do hard things just as God asked Him. "Love one another as I have loved you" is the second part of this teaching. We know how Jesus was obedient to God and did as He was asked even when it was hard. We know how Jesus treated everyone with love and respect, even those who were unpopular. We know how Jesus made people feel loved. This is how He wants us to love and care for others. This is easy to do when it is our parents or our friends. What about when it is our brother or sister or someone who is mean, or someone who is different? Love is not just a warm fuzzy feeling we get. It is an action. To love means to live our lives showing love. Being kind, fair, respectful and caring to EVERYONE is how we love (ALL) others as Jesus loves us.

I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.



Activity Ideas- From CAFOD

Ask the children to colour in the accompanying illustration, and to draw in themselves and their friends into the group of children – one of the children in the illustration is just an outline which they can add their own features on to. On the back ask them to write a prayer giving thanks for their friends, or to write or draw how they will be good friends to others around the world this week.

Make a paper chain of friends with the children:

- Fold a sheet of paper, accordion-fashion, (like you would to make a paper fan) in three-inch strips so that all sections are equal. The number of folds in the paper determines the number of people in the chain.
- On the top piece of the folded paper, draw a person whose hands extend to touch the folds of the paper on each side.
 - · Carefully cut around the person, making sure NOT to cut where the hands meet the folds.
 - Open up the paper and you will have a chain of several people holding hands.
- Get the children to colour them in with crayons. They can also name the paper people as different people in their friendship group including some of the children from around the world featured in CAFOD's website and resources at cafod.org.uk/primary

Ask the children to go home and share all that they have heard and thought about today and to ask the people they live with who their friends are! If the children have written a prayer giving thanks for their friends encourage them to say this at home during the week. Ask them to show their love for others both here and around the world over the coming week as Jesus asks us to.
