#### You will need:

\*Water

\*A clear glass or plastic cup

# Knowledge & Understanding

1 - Choose a gummy bear

2 – Fill 1/3 of the cup with water and place the gummy bear inside.

3- Leave the gummy bear for up to 4 days and compare with a dry gummy bear.

# <u>RE</u>
