Here are homework tasks that will help your child to continue to make <u>proaress</u> through the Year 1 curriculum.

RE: Pentecost: The feast of the Holy Spirit

Pentecost is a holy day. It is the day when the Holy Spirit came down upon the disciples. Jesus gave this message to His disciples before He ascended into Heaven: The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and make you remember all that I have told you.

John 14: 26

Draw a picture of a symbol of the Holy Spirit. It could be a tongue of fire, it could be a gust of wind or it could be a dove.

Science: *Work scientifically to explore plants.*

Children often forget that trees are plants too. Look around your local area and find out more about the trees around you. Can you name them? Do you know what its different parts are?

Maths: This week finish off looking at capacity and begin multiplication.

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
