**Geography:** *Investigate places* 

Find out key facts about Antarctica.

Locate Antarctica on globes, digital maps and atlases and find the South Pole. Do a virtual visit using Google Earth and research images of the Geographical South Pole.

Create a table- top map of
Antarctica using junk materials.
Include a South Pole, some mountains
and ice shelves. Provide small play figures for imaginative play.
Or create a 'shoebox' environment using junk modelling.

Find out about the animals that live there such as the different types of Penguins and Whales and create some drawings and Funky Facts about these.

Make some simple comparisons using Venn diagrams and drawings to show some differences and similarities between the Arctic and Antarctic.
