

# Year 1 Home Learning Ideas 18.05.20

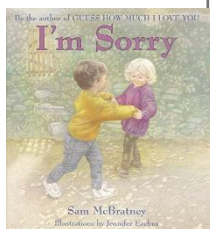
## RE: Reconciliation: Being Sorry

This week we start our new RE Topic: Being Sorry

Read "I'm Sorry" by Sam McBratney, or watch this video of the story: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oFvxzcltIjU>

Think about these questions:

- How do you think the boy and the girl feel?
- What choices has the girl made?
- What good choices have you made?
- How did you feel?
- What happens when you make a wrong choice?
- How did you feel?



## Science: Work scientifically to explore evergreen and deciduous plants.

Recall how trees change during the different seasons.

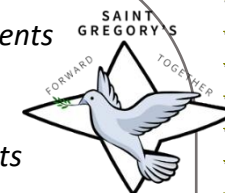
- Think about why some trees lose their leaves in autumn.
- Do all trees lose their leaves in autumn?
- Remember Christmas trees? These are still green in winter. Why do you think this is?

Go outside and collect leaves. Try to include pine needles, holly and other evergreen tree leaves. What is different about them?

**Maths:** This week we will complete some work on measurements. You will need a ruler or a tape measure.

- Compare length and height
- Measure length using non-standard and standard units

<p><b>Compare Lengths and Heights</b></p> <p>Could the elephants use better words to compare their heights?</p> <p>These carrots are the same length.</p> <p>Do you think this is true? What could you do to find out?</p> <p>Compare the length and height of these vehicles.</p>	<p><b>Measure Length</b></p> <p>True or False?</p> <p>The truck and the train are the same length because they are both 4 bricks long.</p> <p>The height of the doll's house is 10 blocks.</p> <p>Both boxes are 3 cars long.</p>	<p><b>Measure Length (2)</b></p> <p>The scissors are 12cm long.</p> <p>Do you agree? Explain why or why not.</p> <p>The book is 13 centimetres tall.</p> <p>Is this correct? Tell me about your answer.</p> <p>The ribbons are both 15cm long.</p> <p>Is this true? Can you find a way to prove it?</p>
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If it is not possible for you to print these, please talk through the questions and answer verbally with your parent.

#### Writing:

- Writing sentences using 'and' to join ideas. Imagine you live deep in the ocean. Write three sentences explaining what you can see. Try to use the word 'and' in each sentence.  
Here is an example: I can see a whale and some seaweed.
