TASK: Write a sorry prayer, that Levi might have said to Jesus, saying why he was sorry.

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
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**Science:** To observe seasonal changes.

Divide your paper into 4 sections and label each section Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter. Using an old catalogue cut out pictures of clothes and place them in the correct season. If you don't have a catalogue you could draw pictures of the cloths e.g a wooly hat for winter or sunglasses for summer.

You will need a measuring jug.


