### Science: To observe seasonal changes: Shadows

On a sunny day, pick a tall object in the garden, such as a post or climbing frame. Alternatively, you can stand in the same spot at each hour. (You may want to set an alarm to remind you). Each hour draw around the shadow with chalk if you can or take a photograph and ask an adult to help you measure the shadow.

Think about what happens to the shadow over the course of a day.

Maths: This week we will begin some work on multiplication

- Count in 2s
- Count in 5s
- Count in 10s
- Add equal groups

### Things to try when counting in 2s, 5s or 10s:

- Count forwards and backwards
- Start from different numbers e.g. count backwards in 2s from 20; count forwards in 5s from 25
- Search for "skip counting" videos on YouTube. Find ones you like to sing along to.




## English:
