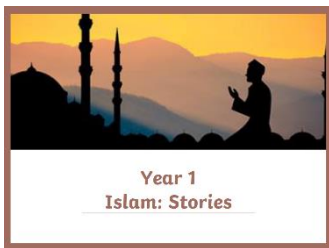




Year 1 Home Learning Ideas 15.06.20 – Multi-Faith Week

RE: Islam: Special Stories



If we were in school this week, our focus would be on the world religion Islam. Extra Dojo points will be awarded for work sent in about Islam this week. A slideshow of lessons has been prepared for you and is available on our school website.

Overview of lessons:

1. The importance of stories: Every family has stories. What is your favourite story about someone you know?
TASK: Draw a picture and write about your favourite family story.
2. Who was Muhammad?

3. Stories about Muhammad:
TASK: Listen to the story of "The Child and the Dates". Think about something that you have done that had an impact on others.

5. Muhammad is important for Muslim people. Who are the Muslim people?

Making Doubles

Roll 2 dice. How many doubles can you make?

Make Equal Groups - Sharing

How can we share 20 pearls equally into 5 bags?

Penny: Share them into 5 groups.

Percy: Put 5 in each bag.

Who do you agree with?

Which bag will have more gems if they are shared equally?

Can you prove it?

Make Equal Groups - Grouping

Use counters to make equal groups.

Can we make two equal groups?

What did you find out? Can we make any equal groups?

There are 2 teams. Each team gets 5 balls from the bag. How many balls do the 2 teams have in total?

There are 20 rings in total. How many ways can they be put into equal groups?

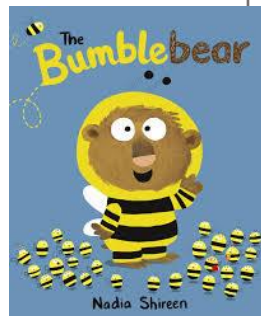
Fancy something different this week? Did you know that brown bears live in North America? Listen to this story about a very clever bear called Norman:
