




Luke 15: 20-21

We have choice – sometimes we choose well, and sometimes wrongly




Explore


TASK: Write a sorry prayer, that Levi might have said to Jesus, saying why he was sorry.

Zacchaeus the Chief Tax Collector

Reveal

Zacchaeus the Tax Collector

When we are sorry for doing something wrong we must **mean** it and we must **show** that we mean it.

What did Zacchaeus do that showed how sorry he was for what he had done wrong? Think about how **you** could show that you mean it when you say sorry. Could you give your family a hug to say sorry? Could you give back something extra if you took something that wasn't yours?

TASK: Draw a picture to show what you would do to show that you are sorry. Try to show that you are really sorry by doing something extra for the people that you have upset.

God's Promise: I will help you

When you call for help I will answer 'Here I Am', and I will help you. You, in your turn, be ready to help one another.

Reveal

Be a kind friend and never a bully.

Don't pick fights and be ready to make friends. Instead of making fun of someone or telling hurtful jokes about them, try to find something good to say.

Share what you have especially with people who have little or nothing. When you act like this everyone will be happy.

You are like a light that shines in the dark; you never know who will be cheered up.

Everyone who acts in this way is working with God.

Everyone who acts in this way makes the world a better place.


Based on Isaiah 58: 9-11 God's Story 2



TASK: Around the candle write words or phrases that will show how you can be kind and 'be a light that shines in the dark'.

Reveal

TASK: Complete a card in the shape of a thought bubble, with the words 'Sorry!' on one side and 'Thank you!' on the other to keep under your pillow.

When you go to bed, think about the good things that have happened and say, 'Thank you!' to God for them. Then think about the wrong choices they have made and say 'Sorry!'



Saying sorry

Sometimes we quarrel with each other and have arguments, it is important to say sorry and to forgive others when they say sorry to us. God always forgives us when we are sorry.

Reveal

TASK: Learn this sorry prayer God, our Father, thank you for loving me. I am sorry for the times I have not shown love to others.



Help me always to live like Jesus. Amen.

We are happy when we love one another.

Jesus said, "I'm going to give you a new rule.

Reveal

It's this: Love one another. I love each one of you, and I want you to love each other.

When you're all happy together, everyone will know that you love one another, and that you are my friends."

my friends."

In John's gospel, we hear about a new rule Jesus gave us. It is a rule which Jesus always kept. Remember that He is always there to help us to follow this rule.

TASK: Imagine a world where everyone kept this rule.

Write a recipe for "Creating a World full of Love"

E.g. *Take a bowl full of kindness and sprinkle it with love. Next add a dollop of friendliness.* etc

End of Topic Liturgy

Remembering, celebrating and responding to the experience of choice – sometimes we use it well; sometimes wrongly. God helps us to choose well and to be sorry. God forgives us.



Respond

Now that you have explored the ideas for this topic, spend some time thinking about the key things you want to remember.

Listen to some quiet music and spend time recording what you found interesting and how you will keep God's new rule to love one another.

With your family, take part in a liturgy, using the resources on the following slides to help you.

Gather

Set up a prayer area and choose what to place on it to help you focus on your liturgy. Make a sign of the cross and then talk about the "Big Question."



Respond

Suggestions for your prayer focus area:

- Find a nice piece of cloth or tea towel to lay over a small box
- A cross or a religious statue
- A Bible open at the story of Zacchaeus
- Spring flowers
- Light an LED candle
- Play some gentle background music
