


St Gregory's Catholic Academy Curriculum Newsletter Year 2

Autumn Term



Religious Education

In our "Beginnings" topic we will learn about the Creation Story, starting our day with prayer and thanking God for our beginnings. After this, we will start our next topic, "Signs and Symbols" where we will discover more about the Sacrament of Baptism. We will end the term by studying "Preparations." We will find out more about Advent and how Catholics prepare to celebrate Christmas.

This half term we will cover Place Value. We will count, recognise the place value of and write numbers to 100. We will count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s and, given a number, identify 10 more and 10 less. We will also compare and order numbers to 100.

Later on in the term, we will improve our addition and subtraction skills, increasing our fluency and problem solving. We will also look more closely at 2D and 3D shapes.

History / Geography

Our history topic this term is the Gunpowder Plot. We will learn key facts and ask questions about this important event. We will compare the past and how life was in 1605.



In Geography, we will learn about the world, improve our map skills and explore different continents.

The Arts

This term we are focussing on creativity and imagination in Art! We will explore drawing, painting and sculpture focussing on the story "The Dot." Look out for our virtual gallery coming later this term!



In Design Technology we are finding out more about healthy food and where our food comes from. We will consider what makes a healthy lunch and how to prepare food safely.

PE

This term PE will be on a Thursday and we will be developing our teambuilding skills. We will also be improving our speed, agility, throwing and catching skills. Please come to school on a Thursday in your PE kit.



Phonics

In November we will take our Phonics screening test. We will



be spending this half term practicing and consolidating our knowledge of our Set 1, 2 and 3 sounds. Don't forget to practice at home too!
