PE

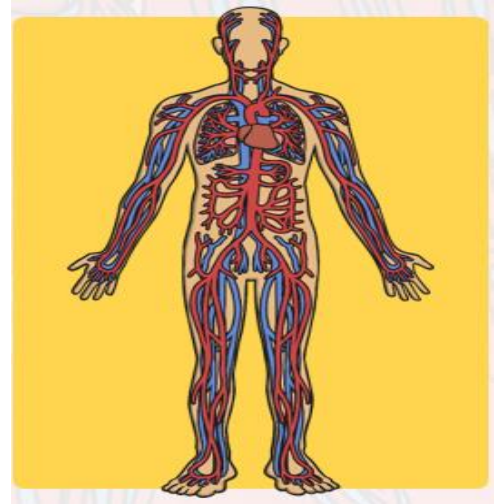
-Complete at least 30 minutes exercise daily- this can be any activity you choose.

RE - Our new topic is Pentecost- Serving. *The Holy Spirit enables people to become witnesses.*

Christians believe that the spirit of God is active in each person and in a special way in the community of believers which is the Church. The Feast of Pentecost is the celebration both of the gift of God's Holy Spirit and the trust God places in people to be witnesses in the world.

When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the church.' Then the church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun.

Read the scripture attached and answer the following questions, verbally. Then, Complete the task below.

- How do you think the disciples felt when they heard these words?
- What did Jesus mean when he said '...the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled?'
- What do you understand by the disciples being the witnesses of Jesus?

- Why do you think some of Jesus' disciples were in doubt?
- What mission did Jesus give his disciples?

Then he said to them 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you – that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled'.


Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures and he said to them,
