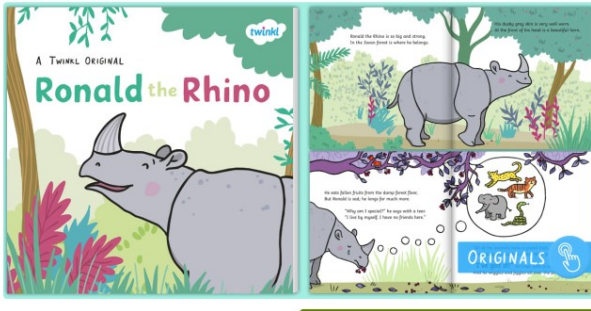

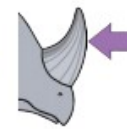
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## Ronald the Rhino Challenge Cards

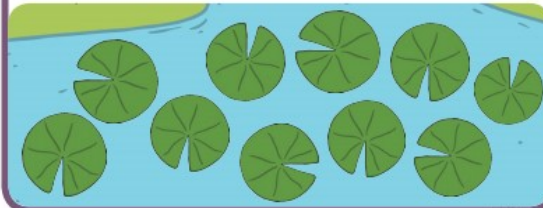
2. Leopard saw 6 monkeys in one tree and 2 monkeys in another tree. How many monkeys did he see altogether?

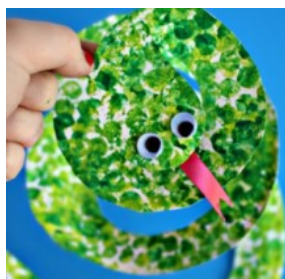
## Creative Development and World Knowledge

## EFYS Jungle and Rainforest Science Experiments Resource Pack

**Colour in Green Leaves**  
Science Experiment

**Method**

- Take the children out to collect 3 green leaves.
- Put the leaves into the jar. Use scissors to snip the leaves into very small pieces. Use the scissors to transfer the leaves.
- Adult job - Rubbing alcohol into the jar so it just covers the leaves.
- Cover the jar with cling film and place the jar high up so the children cannot reach the jar. Leave for 3 hours.
- Cut a strip of coffee filter paper and place it into the jar so that it is just touching the rubbing alcohol.
- Leave for a couple of minutes and then check. You should see a greenish colour on the coffee filter paper.
- After 10-15 minutes, the rubbing alcohol will have moved up the filter paper and left bands of colour along the paper.

You can also extend this experiment by repeating it with different coloured leaves and comparing the different colours and lines they make on the coffee filter paper.

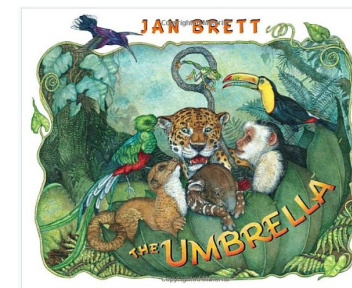
What can you see on the filter paper?

**Science Experiment**  
Shaving Foam Rain Clouds

What colours are you going to choose?  
Can you mix them with water in some small bowls?  
When you've squeezed the shaving foam, what colour are you going to see first?  
What do you think is going to happen to the coloured water?  
But it takes a long time for it to start 'raining'.  
Where does the coloured water come through the cloud quickest?  
Is it near the edge of the glass or in the middle?  
What different colours are made by the 'rain'?
