




Writing Challenge:

Have your grown up help you read and write these words. Our challenge this week is to practice our numbers to 20 again! You will need things to count like sea shells, pine cones or beads. You can use Lego or other bricks to build the staircase.

Counting to 20

Guidance

Provide opportunities for your child to count beyond 10 learning the number names in order. Once they can confidently say the number names, provide opportunities for them to match them to quantities and symbols. Prompt your child to recognise that as we count, each number is one more than the number before building staircases to show the growing pattern within numbers to 20.



Key questions

How many do I have?


Make the number which is one more than mine.

Make the number which is one less.

If I make 12, can you make one more?

What number comes after 20? And then?

Encourage the children to represent numbers to 20 in different ways.



One more, one less




