Priority 1	Ensure appropriate level of support is in place for disadvantaged pupils on the SEND register.

School Support Plans for each pupil ensure that progress is carefully monitored and targets tailored to the individual needs of the pupils. One to one support put in place for ECHP children finding it difficult to adjust to school life after missing out on nursery provision.	
Priority 2	Provide phonics and early language interventions for pupils who are New to England and have English as an additional language.
KS1 and KS2 NTE groups established. All children assessed using the NASSEA framework and all made good progress in early reading and language acquisition.	
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Narrowing the attainment gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils.
