you are the branches."

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 2nd May 2021



Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples."



Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine and you are the branches. But just as a branch cannot produce fruit unless it remains joined to the vine, you cannot produce fruit unless you remain in me. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away. But if you remain in me and my words remain in you, then you will produce much fruit to the glory of God."

Ask your child what the word 'growing' means to them (other than increasing in height or weight). Ask them which one of the above 'fruits' (see the 'Good News for Families' section at the top of this page) would they particularly like to grow in. Why did they choose that 'fruit'? In what ways could growing in that fruit help them? Then tell your child how they've grown as a person (and in goodness) in recent months.

Each new day is an opportunity to grow in goodness. Regularly praying together is a powerful way for the family to keep growing in love. What else can we do to keep growing in goodness in this coming week? Perhaps we can: always try to be fair with others; avoid doing wrong and always try to do what is right; spend some time reading the words of Jesus in the gospels; try to be more patient.

Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for the people who help us to **grow** in your love and please help us to keep **growing** in goodness. Amen.


