

MATHS



Throughout the term, we will learn about:

Multiplication and division

Applying addition, subtraction, multiplication and division knowledge, skills and methods to word problems.

Length and Perimeter

Measuring in mm, cm and m, measuring and calculating length and perimeter using all operations.

Fractions

Identifying and understanding the numerator and denominator of unit and non-unit fractions, equivalent fractions, counting in fractions on a number line.

Mass and Capacity

Measure and read scales in g, kg, ml & L, add and subtract mass, capacity and volume.

At the end of year 2, your child should be confident in having quick recall of their 2x, 5x and 10x tables. If your child is still finding these tricky, please help at home using resources shared by their class teacher as well as using TT Rockstars and Sum Dog daily,




Created to Love Others

GEOGRAPHY



What are we learning?

Mountains What a mountain is, mountain ranges, people that live on mountains, the Andes and the mountains of the Uk.

Settlements & cities Settlement types, hamlet, village, town, city etc; land use, settlements by rivers. Major cities in the UK - locational overview London as a conurbation and London boroughs Two cities: Cardiff and London, including economy & transport. How do people move about in Cardiff? How do people move about in London? Patterns of settlement in Cardiff and London

Agriculture Arable farming, pastoral farming, mixed farming, how farming changes the land-scape. How the food we eat affects farming, sheep farming in Wales - Snowdonia, revisit locational knowledge.

SCIENCE



Plants

In this unit, we will learn how to: identify and describe the functions of different parts of plants and explore the requirements of plants for life and growth. We will also investigate the way in which water is transported within plants and explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

Light

In this unit, we will learn how to: recognise that we need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light. We will learn how light is reflected from surfaces; and recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous unless we protect our eyes.



HISTORY



What are we learning?

Cradles of Civilisation The land between 2 rivers (Mesopotamia & Ancient Egypt), Gilgamesh, The first farming civilisations, and Art in ancient civilisations.

Indus Valley Civilisation Sites and artefacts in the Indus Valley, Similarities and differences between Indus Valley and Sumer and Egypt (e.g. writing, monuments) Craftsmanship, trade, barter.

Persia and Greece Ancient Persia and its empire to set geographical & political context, Ancient Greek city states, inc. Sparta and Athens. Why/how did they form?, Homer's Iliad, Greco-Persian wars, Ancient Greek language Peloponnese War, Greek religion – gods and goddesses

COMPUTING





In computing, we will be looking at how to stay safe online, programming and sequencing sounds. We will create sequences in a block-based programming language to make music.



ENGLISH

We will read 'The Last Garden' by Rachel Ip and 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin' by Michael Morpurgo. The children will write in a range of genres, building toward writing their own version of these narratives. We will focus on the literary theme of Hope and Healing.

We will:

- develop characters and settings
- write engaging advertisements
- write instructional flyers
- develop writing in role using dialogue
- write information reports
- write formal letters
- focus on punctuation and handwriting (including cursive handwriting)

Ideas to support your child

- You could find books related to our topics at your local library and read regularly with and to your child. Be sure to as lots of questions!
- Ask your child to write for a variety of purposes at home. Perhaps you could ask them to write a letter to a family member or a friend. Or they could write a diary entry about an event they have been to and bring it in to show the class. Any excuse you can find!
- Support your child to learn their spellings.
- Remember to use Reading Eggs regularly to access books online.
