

MATHS

Throughout the term, we will learn to:

- Compare fractions.
- Add and subtract fractions.
- Find equivalent fractions.
- Learn how to use a 24-hour clock.
- Look at how to use a.m. and p.m.
- Find how to work out the duration of a event
- Work out right angles in a shape.
- Learn what is horizontal and vertical.
- To be able to recognize and describe
 3-D shapes.
- Recap how to compare and measure mass.
- Look at how to measure the capacity of an object.
- Add and subtract capacity and mass.

Ideas to support your child

- By Year 3, your child should be confident in having quick recall of their 3x, 4x and 8x tables. If your child is still having difficulties with their times tables, please help them learn them, as it will have a major impact on their mathematical development. Use Times Tables Rockstars at least weekly as children will also start learning other times tables such as the 3x, 4x and 8x tables.
- Work with your child to make sure they are confident in telling the time accurately to the hour, half hour, quarter hour and 5 minute intervals.

RE AND RHE



In R.E this term, we will be learning about the celebrations of Easter and Pentecost. In this unit, we will learn about the resurrection of Jesus. We will also explore Jesus' appearance to his disciples. We

HOMEWORK

GEOGRAPHY

What are we learning?

Our topics for the summer term is Settlements and Cities. This half term they will be learning what a Settlement is. Children will be learning the difference between a Village, town and city. They will be learning the characteristics that make up each settlement and how we can differentiate between them.



HISTORY

Ancient Greece

Children will be learning about the Ancient Greeks and how they lived. We will be focusing on the invention of democracy and how that has impacted future life. We will also be looking out Ancient Greek literature specifically Homer's epic the Odyssey.



ICT

In Computing, we will practise word processing skills. We will also have online safety lessons, discussing why and how to be safe online and what information not to give out online. Please ensure you monitor your child when he/she is online so they are using the internet safely.

Ideas to support your child



- Visit the Ancient Greeks: Science and Wisdom exhibition at the Science museum. It is exploring the impact that Ancient Greece had on the modern world. It closes on the 5th June 2022.
- Visit a city, town and village during the May half term. Can you spot the differences and why they are classed as each.
- Ask your child lots of questions about what they are learning about the Ancient Greece, and allow them to visit your local library to choose books related to the topic.
- Look at maps and atlases with your child and help them to learn the location of countries in Europe as well as the names of their capital cities.



P.E.

Year 3's P.E. day is **Tuesday**.

They need to arrive to school already dressed in full PE kit. As we aim to carry out the lessons regardless of the weather conditions, they may also need a jumper and jogging bottoms.

Children will be taking part in practical problem solving sessions, exploring what it means to work as an effective team with a focus on co-operation.

ENGLISH

What are we learning?

We will begin by learning suspense tale called 'The Manor House.' We will then use a variety of writing techniques to plan and write our very own suspense story.

We will also learn how to use heading, subheading and formal writing style to plan and write an information report about woodland creatures.

Ideas to support your child
