Interned projects, consolidation and froblem Solving:
The projects provide an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2. This gives teachers the opportunity to ensure any possible gaps in understanding are addressed before children move on to secondary school ondary school.

The projects have been designed to explore maths in real life contexts, allowing children to see how important maths is in all aspects of life. As well as this, we have looked to provide cross-curricular links where appropriate, for example, including tasks that develop design and technology skills and geographical knowledge. They also provide a great opportunity to explore and develop enterprise.

They are a statutory part of the curriculum and they will assess the children's understanding in Maths, SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Reading. Below is a breakdown of when the tests will be carried out. All tests will be carried out in the mornings. It is vitally important that pupils have a good night's sleep and arrive at school on time each day. If your child wears glasses, please ensure they bring them to school each day.

Children will be taking part in practical problem solving sessions, exploring what it means to work as an effective team with a focus on co-operation.


Units this term include basketball, athletics and swimming.
