#### Attendance


Thank you to all of you who have done your best this term to ensure your children come to school every day that they are well. Good attendance is essential for making good progress in learning and establishing good social and emotional relationships. There are some pupils whose attendance and punctuality is a concern.

We monitor pupil attendance which falls below 90% with our Education Welfare Officer.

For some families they will continue to be required to attend meetings at school; others are referred to our school nurse and more serious cases are referred to our local authority to be closely monitored.

Thank you to Joe and Jess for bringing the children so far!


It was a very enjoyable and entertaining concert. We look forward to seeing them again in the Spring Term to see again how much more progress they have made.
