

English Lessons- Monday- Friday



Below is a series of five lessons we have planned. If you can manage all five then that's great. If not, choose a few to complete with your child. There are challenges for children who can complete the main activity with ease. If your child finds the main activity a struggle, then don't worry about completing the challenge.

Monday	This week we will be looking at a new book - "Dougal's Deep Sea Diary". The book is about an under-water city. Discuss what characteristics a city has. For example, London has streets with shops and restaurants. London has parks with trees and dogs. What might an under-water city look like? Activity Without looking at the book, predict what the under-water city may look like. Will the city have buildings? What sort of creatures may roam the water? Use a full page to express your ideas.	Challenge: Explain your drawing using phonics to construct a sentence. Begin your sentence with "I think" For example I think sharks will be in police uniforms.
Tuesday	Read the book Dougal's Deep Sea Diary up to pages 16-17. Dougal has found a treasure chest! The treasure was 'big news'. TV reporters wanted to interview Dougal. What do you think Dougal might say? Activity Role play Dougal. You have to relay to the reporters what has happened. Write a few sentences explaining what you have found. You must answer the questions - Who are you? - When did you find it? - Where did you find it? - How did you get it out of the water? - What was inside it? Example I am Dougal. On Wednesday I was deep sea diving	Challenge: What did Dougal forget to hand in? How did he feel about this? Why do you think he felt that way? Explain your answer using the word 'because'. Example Dougal felt because he might get in trouble.
Wednesday	Read the book <u>Dougal's Deep Sea Diary</u> . Discuss how the book is constructed. The book shows what Dougal does each day. Listen to the days of the week song. <u>Days of the week - Adam's Family</u> Activity	Challenge: Can you use the word 'and' in your sentences to add extra information? Example
