Common noun = <u>person</u>, <u>place</u> or <u>thing</u> that doesn't need a capital letter e.g. man, shop, game, book, river.

Proper noun = <u>person</u>, <u>place</u> or <u>name</u> of something that starts with a capital letter e.g. Millie, Oxton, Europa Swimming Pool, River Dee.
