## Attendance and Punctuality

As we begin a new school year, it is important that we establish good practices for a productive and successful year. As parents/ carers, it is your legal responsibility to ensure that your child attends school regularly and on time.

You may be aware, from recent media reports, of government changes to legislation for holidays taken in term time. It is an expectation that parents take holidays during the 14 weeks outside of term time. Parents wishing to take their child out of school during term time will need to complete a request form, which Mr Bonner may authorise in **exceptional circumstances.** Unauthorised holidays may result in fixed penalty fines for parents.

If your child is absent due to medical illness, it is your duty to provide the school with a reason for this absence. If you have medical evidence, you will need to show this to your child's class teacher. This could be a medical appointment card or a prescription label.

Parents of pupils whose attendance is a cause for concern will be sent a letter requiring them to meet with the School Attendance Team and / or the local authority Education Welfare Officer.

It is also essential that pupils form good habits of attending school punctually. School starts at **8.55am** and it important that your child is in the playground with their class ready to go into their classroom.

Children who arrive late at school often miss vital parts of early morning learning and can cause disruption for the rest of their class. If your child is late arriving at school, you will need to provide their teacher with a reason for their lateness.

We thank you, in advance, for your support in ensuring the good attendance and punctuality of your child.
