Scarlet Fever

There have been some reported cases of scarlet fever reported to us by parents.

The symptoms of scarlet fever present as; fine sandpaper like rash, high fever, white coated tongue, swollen glands in neck, a flushed face, possible skin peeling. It can be spread through air droplets but infection usually requires close and prolonged contact with someone who has contracted the virus. If you suspect your child may have the symptoms of scarlet fever, you will need to take them to the doctor.

It is important that if the doctor confirms your child has scarlet fever, *they should not attend school until they are better*.

It is also important that you show / provide medical evidence to your child's teacher in the form of a doctor's appointment card and /or the antibiotic prescription.
