



Children in Fisher Fun Club have been learning about Black History Month whilst getting creative and having fun.











Jesus wanted to teach his disciples that they should always pray and never give up. So he told them a story. Jesus said, "There was a judge in a certain town who had neither fear of God nor respect for any other person. In the same town
