

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to

On Wednesday this week St. John Fisher were proud to be represented at the Diocese of Southwark Mass to mark the beginning of the new school year.


