Reminder: you can purchase your child's framed artwork on **ARBOR** until next week. The purchased items will be sent home with children next week.



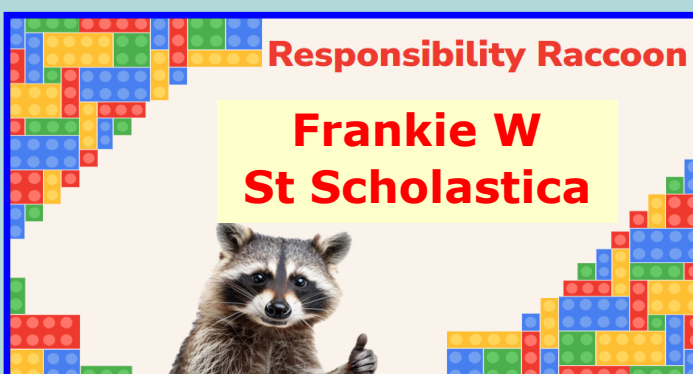
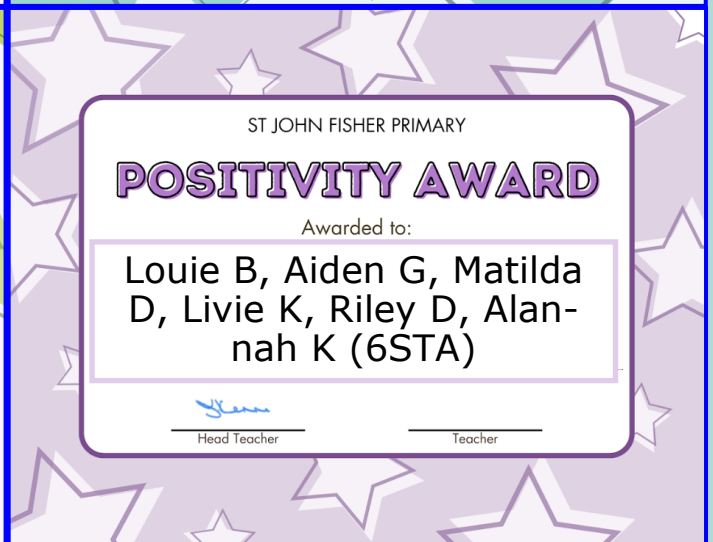
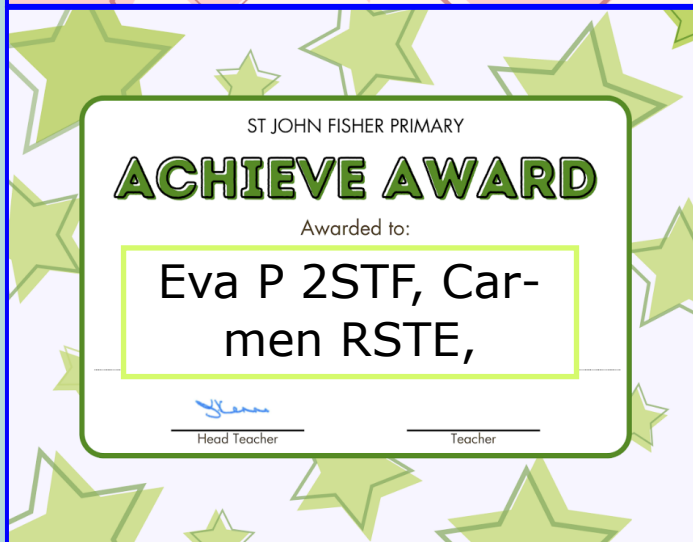
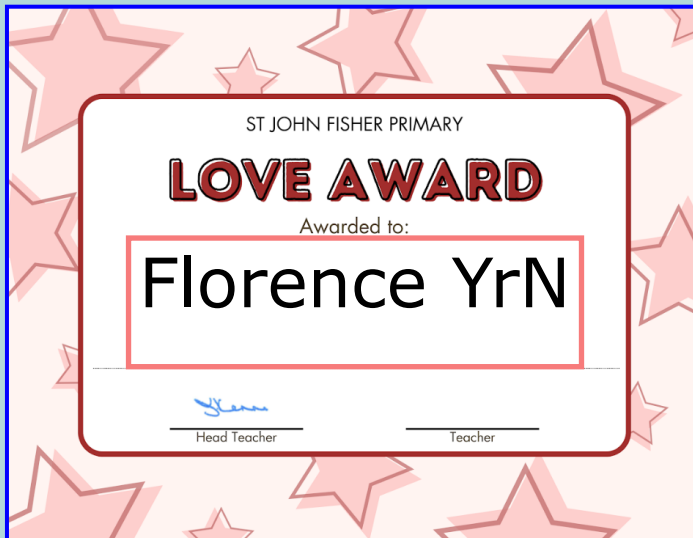
