Breakfast Club and Shooting Stars Wraparound Provision



The Governors have asked me to inform you that there will be an increase in charges from 1st January 2026 to cover the rising costs of staffing, food, electricity etc....

Breakfast Club will be £6.50 per session

Shooting Stars will be £7.50 per hour or £14 for the full session (2hours and 40minutes).



FAQ's on attending shows at school

1. Can I bring children to the shows?

We ask that only children of primary school age upwards come to see the show, and they can only come if they have their own tickets. Children should not be sat on parent's knees and babies are not allowed simply because they distract the children in their performance.

2. Can I use my ticket on another night if I miss a performance?

Tickets can only be used on the night they have been allocated. This is due to the Health and Safety Fire Regulations and strict numbers which must be adhered to.

3. Can I have more than two tickets for my family?

We have over 160 families in school and, therefore, can only allocate two tickets per family due to the Health and Safety Fire Regulations and strict numbers which must be adhered to.

We expect families where the parents do not live together to communicate and ensure each person with parental responsibility has a ticket so that they can both enjoy seeing their child in the show. Extra tickets cannot be issued.

Any extra tickets which become available are allocated on a random draw basis.

I would ask you to be kind when speaking to our Office staff. They work tirelessly and bend over backwards to accommodate everyone's needs. The governors and I will **not tolerate challenges or rudeness** towards the Office staff.

Severe Weather Procedure

In the case of the snow arriving this is the timeline and procedure we are going to implement to try and ensure everyone is kept informed and it is done as soon as possible.

• 7:50am Mrs Healey will decide whether school is open or closed. This is dependent on the number of staff who can get to work. School will use the texting system. If you have not had a text by 8am, please assume school is open.

If school is open:

- A 'key route' will be cleared for access.
- Please enter the new building via the main office.
- Please enter the old building via the back entrance.
- Please don't use the steps, ramps or main playground area.

SNOW!!!!!

Please ensure the children have the appropriate clothing every day.

To include: - Wellingtons or boots (bring shoes for inside school), hat, scarf, gloves, a warm padded coat and waterproofs (if you wish). We will play out in the snow if it isn't too icy, and the children will need to be dressed to keep warm and as dry as possible. Children who do not have the correct footwear will not be allowed to play out.

Care for a Cuppa

As we approach the Christmas performances, I would like to take the opportunity to remind everyone in the school community about the school's policy on this.

Parental right to take photographs.

Parents are not covered by the Data Protection Regulations if they are taking photographs or making a video recording for their own private use. Regulations do not, therefore, stop parents from taking photographs or making video recordings at school events, such as nativity plays.

Parents are not permitted, however, to take photographs or to make a video recording for anything other than their own personal use (e.g. with a view to selling videos of a school event). Recording and/or photographing other than for private use would require the consent of the other parents whose children may be captured on film. Without this consent the Data Protection Regulation would be breached.

Data Protection considerations aside, it is possible to consider banning all filming / recording / photography of school productions, sports days etc. if we felt that this is appropriate. We believe, however, that many parents would consider it to be overcautious to impose such a ban and we would not, at this stage, recommend this course of action. Should we wish to impose any such ban we would take legal advice to ensure that the correct steps are taken, whilst acknowledging that such a ban would be difficult to enforce.
