

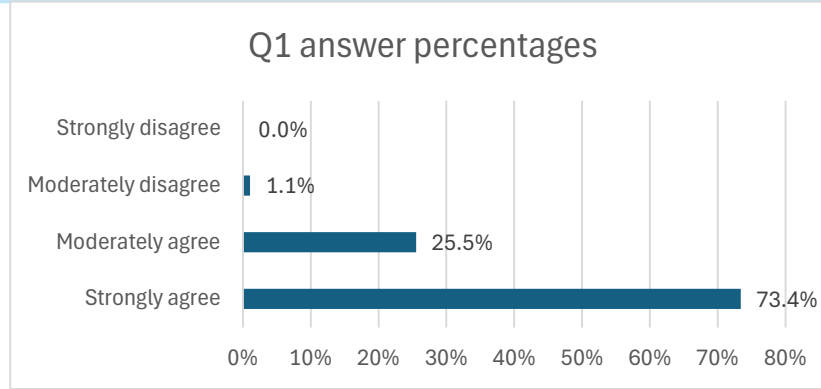

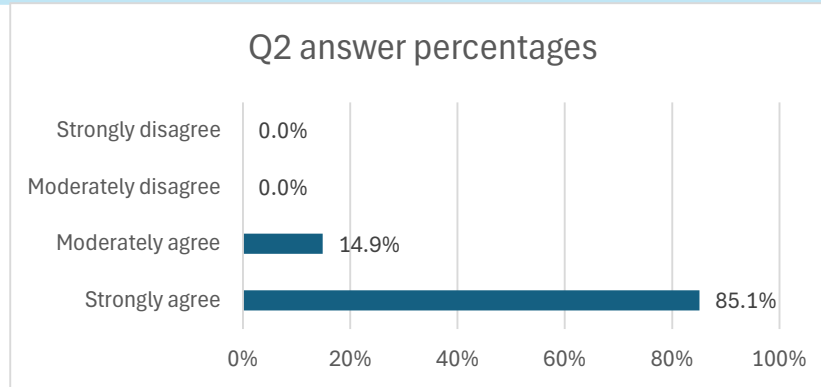

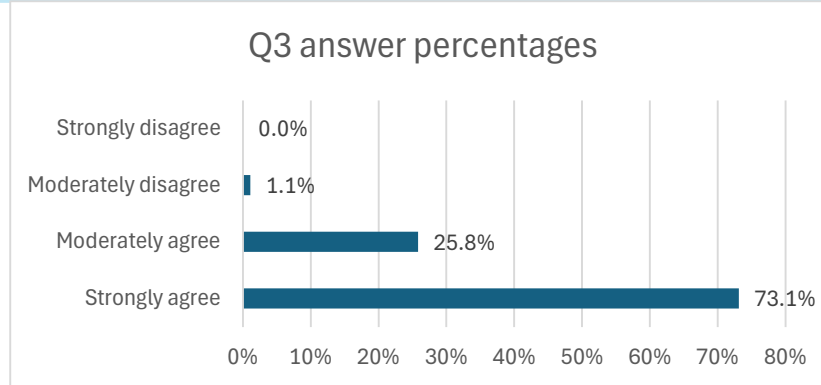

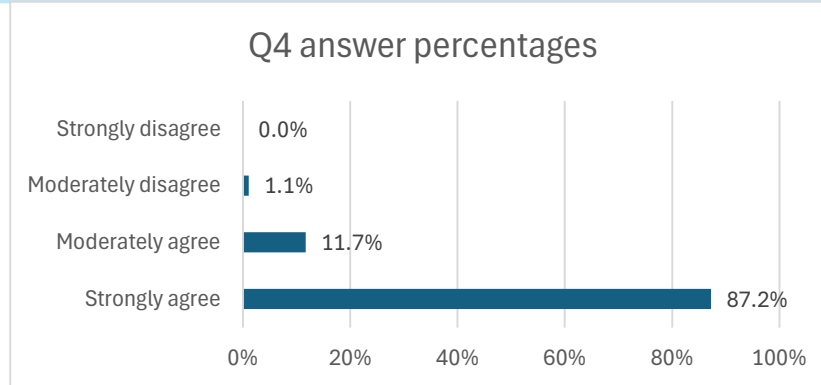

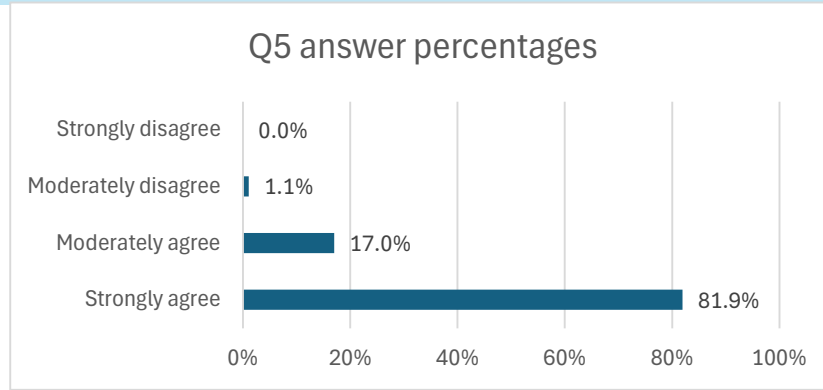

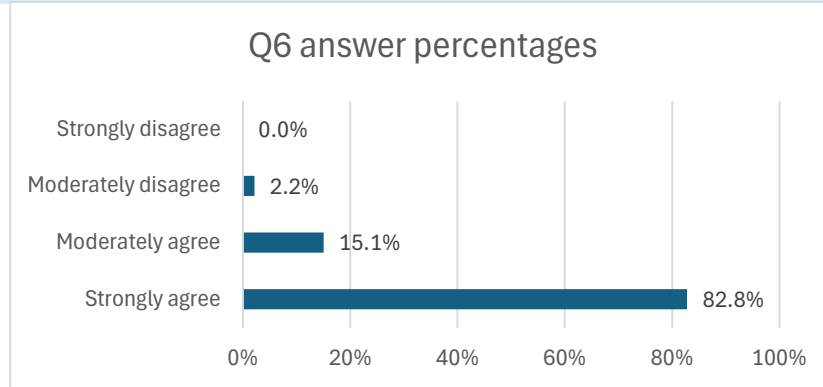

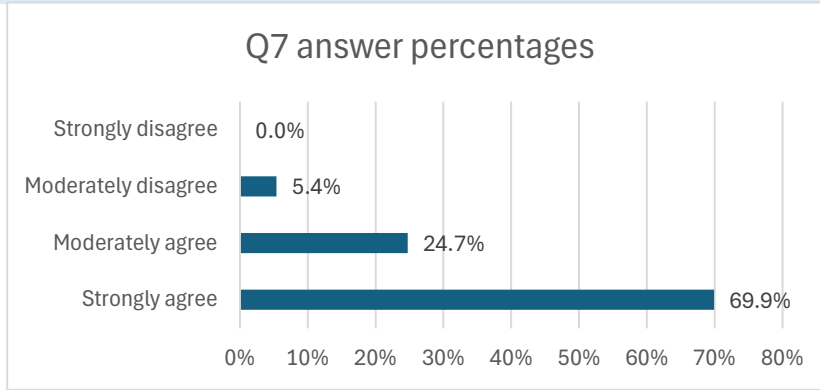

Q7. My child receives enough homework for their age.

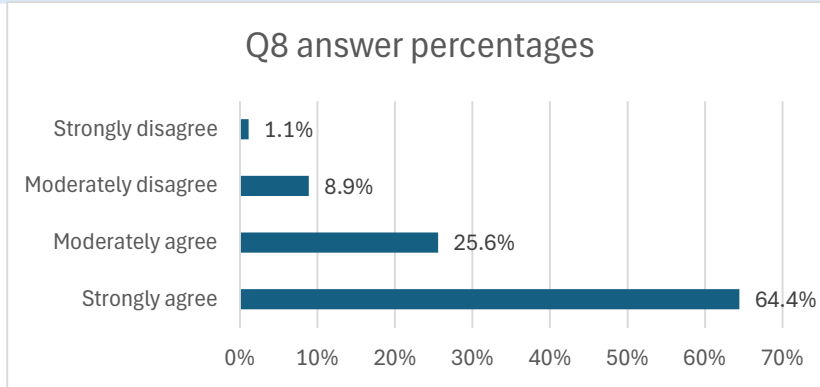

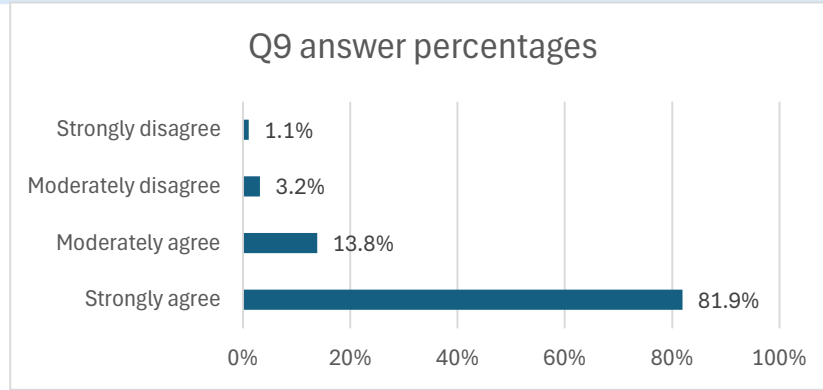

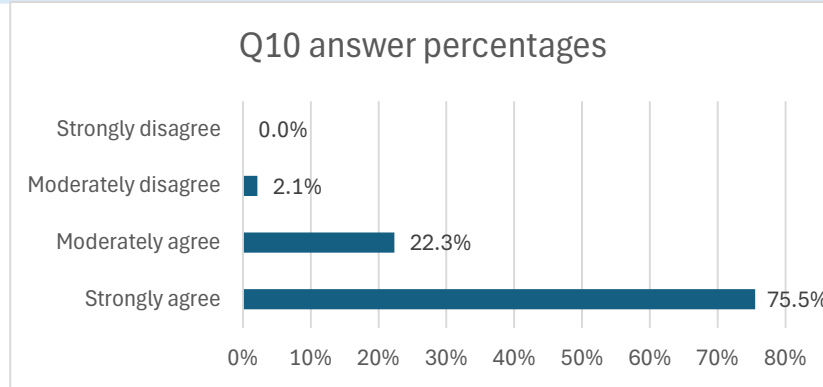

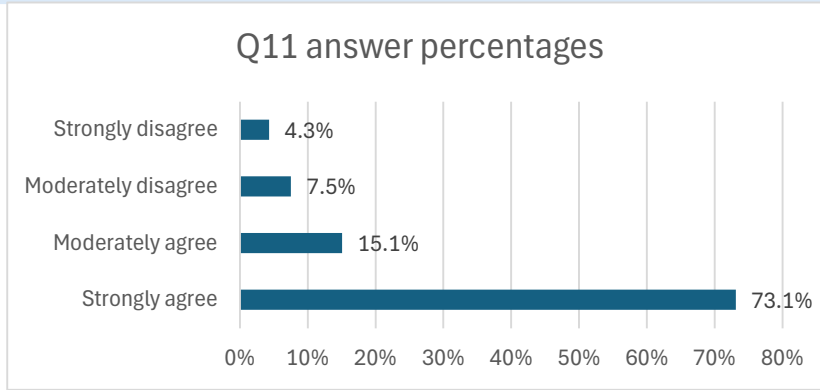

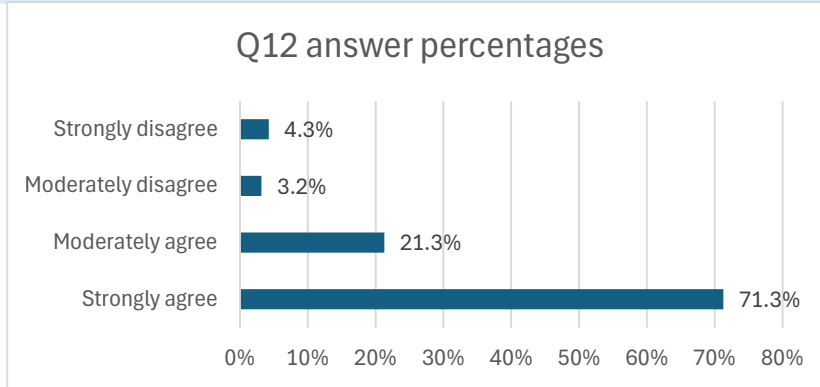

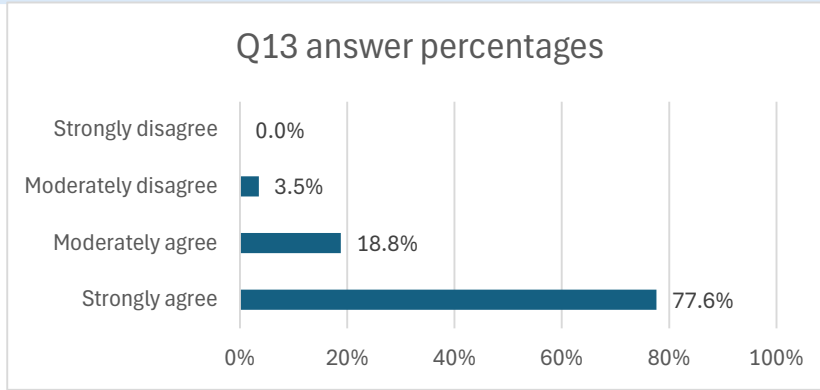

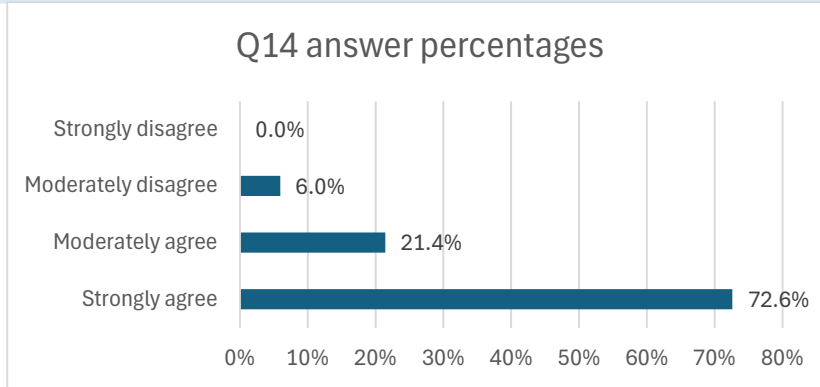

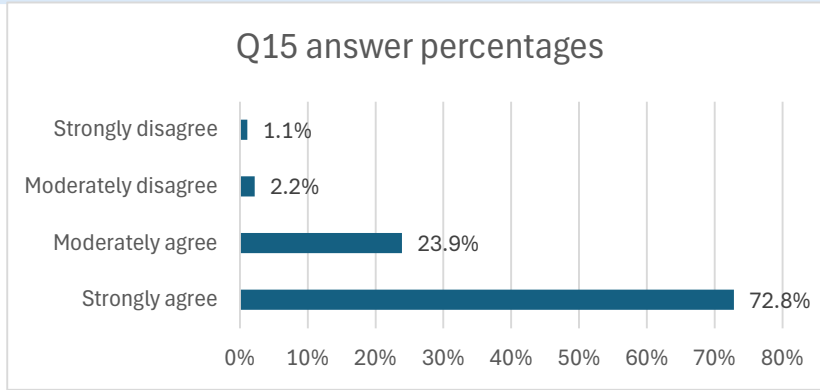

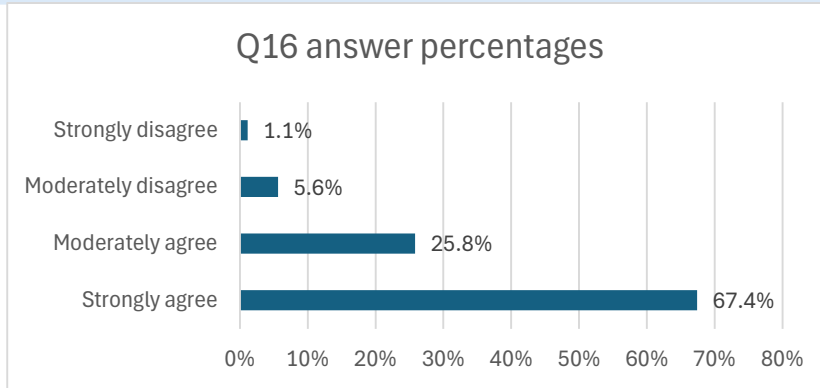

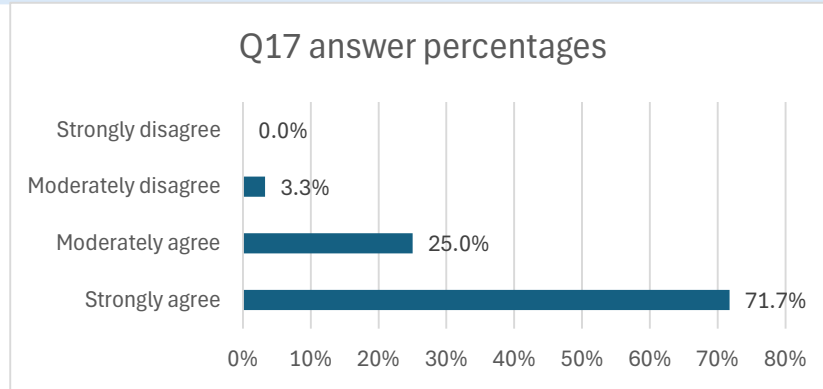

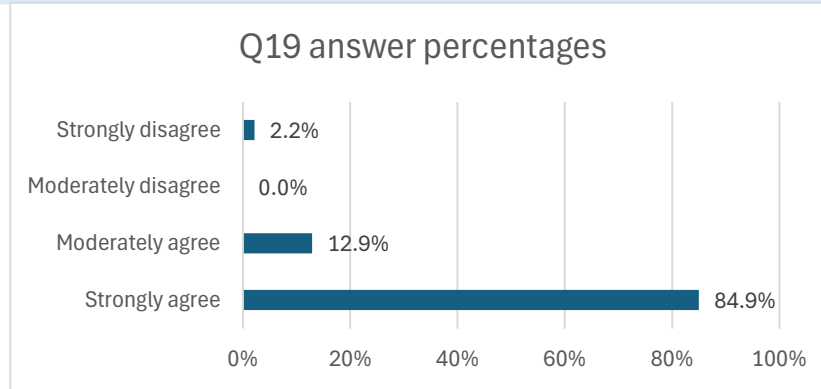

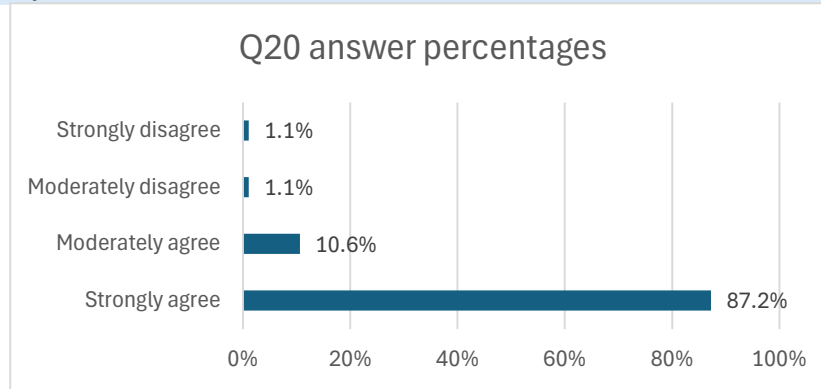

Q21. I am encouraged to attend worship either in school or at church when my child is involved.

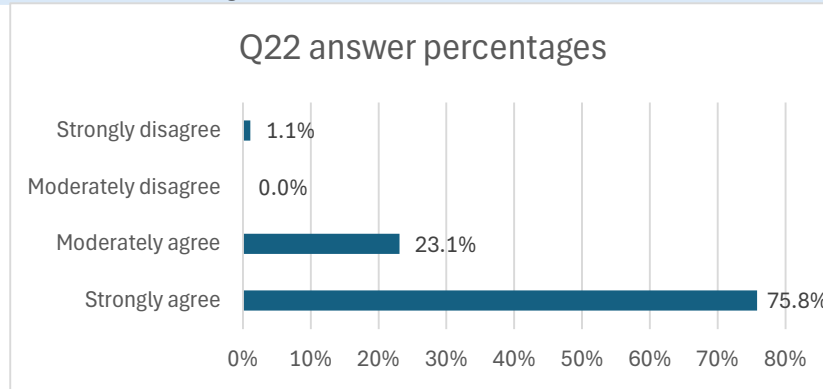

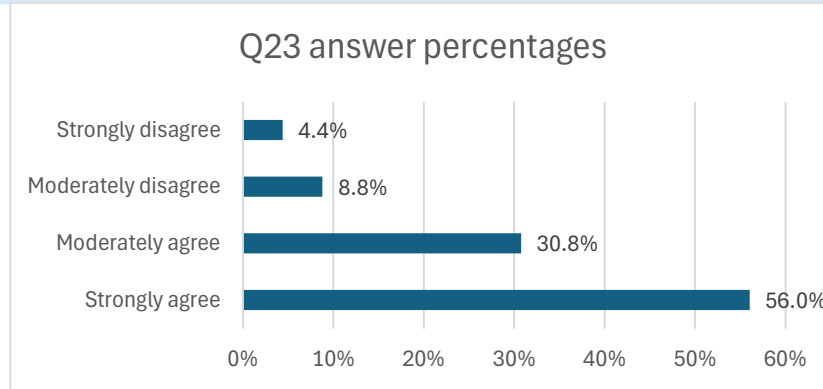

Q23. My child talks about religious education lessons.

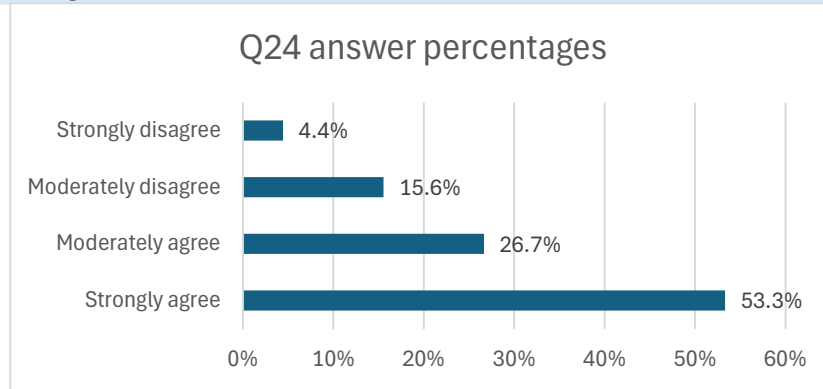

Q24. I am made aware of my child's progress in religious education.

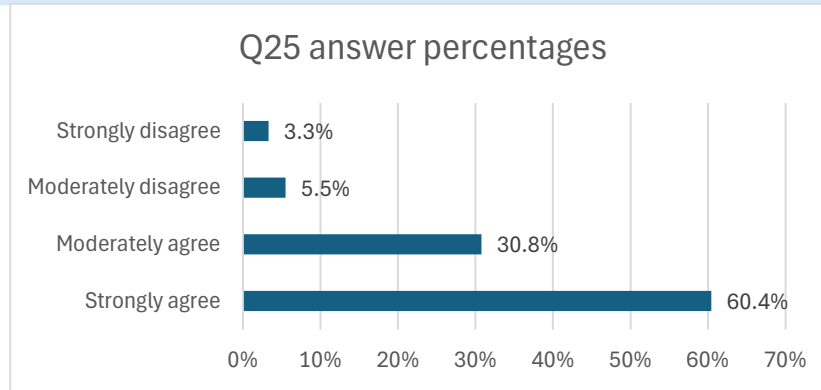

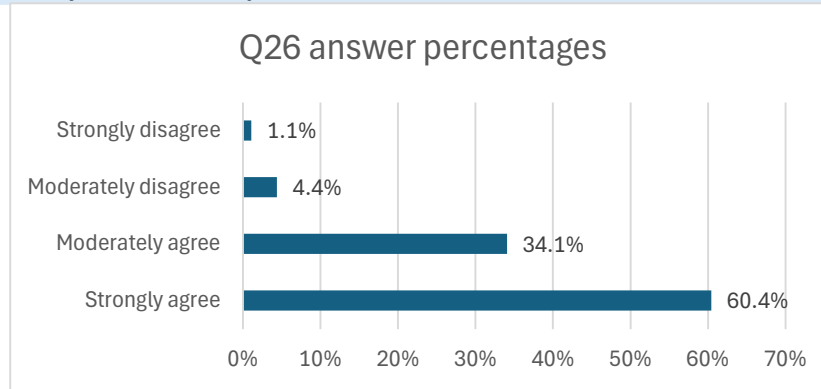

Brilliant school, my little boy is thriving in year 1. He has come on so much with his writing, and his confidence in himself. So pleased we chose this school for him. He is flourishing and that is down to the teachers strong leadership and guidance

The school is excellent with children with physical or obvious disabilities although not so good with children with other needs eg learning disabilities/ behaviour issues. The fact that behaviour stopped my child going on a yr6 residential stopped from getting in the football team stopped from yr5 trip for behaviour reasons when under the rainbow centre and has a EHCP without any alternative/possibilities of a 1 to 1 teacher or any adjustments made a option to us after paying £70 plus for those activities to which we had lost that money now. My child thrives outdoors and cannot manage as well behind a desk inside a classroom but due to his frustration of the work etc doesn't behave as the other children gets punished.

It would be nice if the younger children had a separate area to play at break and lunch time but I understand that isn't always possible

I feel the school would benefit from an extra playground to separate the young ones from the older ones at play time, extra lighting and security cameras would be an added bonus. I feel afterschool club is way too expensive although very professionally run. I am extremely happy with the level of support my child has received although think some issues could have been handled differently.

I love the range of opportunities that are available to my children at Cliviger. I believe it is a caring school family and the staff give up lots of time to facilitate a range of extra opportunities. I like the strong links with the church and that my children value their religious education. I do believe that there are too many events that require family participation and this can impact working families. As much as we would all love to attend these events and they are valuable, they are far too frequent when you have multiple children in school and when parents can't facilitate leave from work it can cause upset for the children and parents.

The focus on outdoor learning is a huge positive.
Some classes are better at sending updates on social media than others.
SLT can appear to be more involved and reactive to some parents than others.

It would be nice to have the opportunity to meet the next class teacher before the summer to help support the transition. The after school club cost a lot more than other local schools but doesn't provide as much food/activities.
I am overall incredibly happy with St John's Cliviger and the opportunities it offers to its pupils are amazing. My children have been fully supported this year as they have navigated some very difficult changes at home. My daughter feels very safe and supported in class and her teacher has become a safe person for her to confide in.

I do feel that, all tho the afterschool club facilities are great and the staff members are amazing, the children could be offered more in the way of a snack or light meal for the cost, when compared to after school clubs at local schools who get a hot meal.
We are very happy at Cliviger St John's, when ever we have had to raise anything we have felt it has been handled and resolved well, as parents we feel heard and confident the school is very child centred. The school makes great use of the facilities available to them. Communication

around what is available at lunch times (school dinners) could be better and enable parents to know what their child is eating, prepare them for what will be available and encourage them to try new things. I am currently unaware of what choices are available, not confident they match to the menu received a long time ago, not sure where I would find this information and when I ask my child they do seem to have some random meals. Overall we are very happy and proud to be a part of the Cliviger school family most importantly our child is happy too... you all do an amazing job and welcome families to take part in school activities

Rory is very curious and has always loved to learn, when he started school I worried that he would start to see learning as something he is forced to do rather than something that he has always actively sought out, however his curiosity is nurtured wonderfully at school and he is often excited to tell me the things he's learnt. His confidence has grown immensely whilst he's been in reception, I think this is because he feels so safe and supported within the school environment so less afraid to try new things and push himself.

I've always been happy with my child's care and education at St John's School. He is content most days and if he does ever have worries and concerns regarding school I am able to communicate this with his teacher and help settle any worries or issues he is having. I receive updates regularly about his development in each lesson and love how family oriented the school is. Excellent school in my opinion so far in my son's first year. One thing I maybe would consider is a couple school trips in eyfs year - this is only a really minor comment though, I have been really impressed and pleased with the school as a whole. My son feels safe and the teachers are excellent and give honest and regular feedback. The school seems really well run by a passionate head and I really value the Christian values that the school emphasises. Something else the school should be really proud of is the behaviour out of school from the older kids and the level of maturity and kindness they show. Keep it up everybody, each day you all do a fantastic job and provide my son with an excellent education.

I feel sometimes the head teacher can be stuck up and borderline rude to certain parents and students. She seems to have her favourites who she gives the time of day. However my child is happy at school . And I would recommend to others for sure.

From a number of incidents & my child relating various instances of disruptive behaviour, I am concerned on the impact to the wider class. Whilst I am comfortable with how the school have dealt with specific incidents, there are still occurrences.

Overall, the teaching & support staff are supportive & the school is a welcoming place for not only the children, but their families too.

Both our children are thriving and content at this school.

I don't think there is anything to improve in fact. As a school I feel you have gone above and beyond for my son. I feel that he has made fantastic progress due to you giving him the time, patience and effort he needed. As well as SALT sessions, he's come on so much in the past two years and that's down you yourself and the staff team.

Breakfast and afterschool club are both friendly and nurturing and he loves attending both.

You should be proud of your school and staff team they are incredible.

Although I am happy with the number of events and initiatives delivered by the school, there is usually emphasis on these being to generate income for the school.

Similarly the CHSA appears to be made up of people who are members for personal perks and not from a sense of altruism. Should they be competing in raffles they are running for example? My biggest bugbear is reserving front row seats at the nativity show, brazen selfishness and not in line with the Christian values of the school

The opportunities that the children of the school get to participate are amazing although I do think at times there is a lot of pressure on working families to carry out the drop offs and pick up/return to school during the working day which for some families is very difficult to co ordinate. There are also a lot of events for parents to attend during school hours which not all parents can attend which causes upset to the children when their parent/s can't attend.

The main area I feel there needs to be is an improvement in is how safeguarding and support for

children who are struggling emotionally is managed. I don't feel that concerns raised or observed have been dealt with empathy or understanding consistently. Thankfully in year 6 this was picked up and dealt with effectively and the children have felt confidence and supported by Miss Stockwell.

Overall, the children's experience of St John's has been amazing but I feel that it's important to provide constructive feedback which can be used in the future.

We feel more personalised feedback and information about how my child is doing at school would be beneficial. The reports sent home are very generic with no personal information and due to the limited times given at parents evenings we feel we do not know much about how he is doing in school and what he is learning.

I am very happy with th progress my child has made, and with the accomodations and adjustments in place to ensure they can thrive, participate, and be fully included in the same learning and activities as their peers despite their learning and physical disabilities.

I find the school has a warm and family like atmosphere and I strongly believe that the leadership team truly valued each child as an individual. They focus on recognising every child's potential and supporting them to achieve it.

My child is well cared for, and their learning is carefully tailored to meet the specific needs. This inclusive approach is evident throughout the entire school. All staff including teachers support staff welfare staff and even the kitchen team contribute to creating and environment where every child feels supported and I cluded.

The CHSA works hard to provide additional oppportunities sand enriching experiences for the children, and it's clear that there is a strong and positive relationship between the school leadership and the CHSA.

Faith is an important part of the school life and community, and we feel that it guides decision making in a way that benefits all children and their families

A more affordable afterschool club, to keep them in after 16:20 the price jumps up and when you have more than one child it becomes expensive.

One of the best things about this school is that all of the staff, including the head teacher know each child really well, and it feels like one big family.
The staff go above and beyond to make each child have positive experiences whilst at the school, a recent example of this was for the y6 residential (which also wouldn't have been possible without the help CHSA).

I believe the school should ensure that both parents are treated equally and that communication is shared fairly with all parents who hold parental responsibility. Maintaining an open-minded and impartial approach helps build trust and supports the best interests of the child.
The school is very well led. This shows in the Children's day to day schooling. Things are quickly resolved before they escalate. My child has been very happy here for the last 3 years. The school manage their space extremely well. There are always lots of fun ,educational activities to do for them all. This school makes my child feel included and safe every day. Thank you Xx

Whilst we enjoy the Christmas performances, we would prefer the traditional Nativity story, as it reflects the Christian ethos and values of the school.

We would also welcome Burnley Youth Theatre's involvement being distributed as evenly as possible across all year groups, with age-appropriate activities for each. This would help ensure that the funding provided through the Cliviger windmill pot is used effectively, maximising both the educational value for the children and the benefit received by the school community.

In most years my older child has responded well to the teachers and their methods.
Communication home could be stronger, across the year groups, what has been put in place for

my child? the opportunities offered to them? why and what the benefits are and updates as to how well these are or aren't working.

The EYFS staff communicate well and really seem to listen when approached with concerns.

It's hard to keep track of who is in my children's classroom as far as teaching staff goes, they seem to spend time with teaching staff not mentioned in the breakdown for each class and the staff.

Especially in KS2. Some of these additional members of staff have different methods and attitudes that are not well received by the children. Changes of staff in the classrooms throughout the term are not communicated home. It comes across sometimes that continuity in the classroom is only for certain year groups.

School lunches are not up to standard and this needs to be addressed.

On the whole my children are happy here and as parents regardless of what we might feel about some aspects of school, we are happy if they are happy.

Such a wonderful, inclusive and welcoming school. The head teacher is always present and is at the heart of the school community. My son is thriving, confident and happy in school.

Keep parents informed if you are concerned about a child's ability to read, write or any other subjects. a

End of term reports are generic and impersonal. This could be improved with a write up from the teacher which reads like they know my child rather than standardised paragraphs.

The attendance reward policy is not in the children's best interests - it punishes rather than incentivises.
