On Tuesday, 19 of our Year 11 students visited Our Ladv and St Bede's School for a Philosophy and Ethics Conference, led by philosopher Peter Vardy. Students participated in two debates, the first on whether there is a moral obligation to breed human genetic excellent and the second on whether quality of life is more important that sanctity of life. The students were a real credit to themselves and to St John's, showing real engagement and confidence in sharing their thoughts in a debate with 250 other students.





On Thursday, GCSE and A Level History students were lucky enough to be able to listen to a talk from Holocaust survivor, Ruth Posner BEM. Ruth's speech was both tragic and inspiring and helped us to truly commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day, as well as extending students' knowledge and understanding of The Holocaust and genocide.

Also on Thursday, we held our first audition session for this year's school production, Addams Family the Musical. 75 students came along to sign-up to being part of this year's musical and learn the songs for next week's auditions.
