We are delighted to announce that we have been awarded a grant of £80,000 from the Wolfson Foundation, an independent grant-making charity dedicated to supporting high-quality research and education. This significant funding will enable us to undertake a major upgrade of our Performing Arts facilities and equipment, including refurbishing our Main Hall, brand new sound, lighting and staging and upgrading our Music classrooms and recording studio. Following our success last year in achieving the Gold Artsmark Award for our contributions to arts education, we wanted to be able to develop our offering further. We are extremely proud of the incredible experiences we offer our students in Performing Arts, from school productions and concerts to trips and workshops, but knew that a complete overhaul of our facilities, spaces and equipment was necessary to improve further. We are delighted and incredibly grateful to have been awarded this amazing grant from the Wolfson Foundation, which will transform our facilities. Such investment is particularly significant in light of the Government's response to the recent Curriculum and Assessment Review, which highlights the need to revitalise Arts education and foster creativity. With this much-needed investment, our inspiring Arts education, fantastic provision and amazing facilities will provide wonderful opportunities for St John's and the wider community.



We are delighted to announce that 10 of our Year 7 students have been accepted onto one of 3 levels of the Parallel Academy programme, providing students with the opportunity to develop their reasoning and problem-solving skills beyond the Maths curriculum over five years. This is a life-changing opportunity that will prepare students for Further Maths A Level, applying to a top university and long-term success in a STEM-related career.
