# **Units of Study**

#### Unit 1 - Changing Awareness of Crime (Controlled Assesment)

• This unit will enable you to demonstrate understanding of different types of crime, the influences on perceptions of crime and why crimes are unreported

#### Unit 2 - Criminological Theories (Exam)

♦ This will allow you to gain knowledge of why people actually commit crime

#### Unit 3 - Crime Scene to Courtroom (Controlled Assesment)

- This unit will provide an understanding of the criminal justice system from the moment the crime has been identified to the verdict
- You will develop the understanding and skills needed to examine information in order to review the justice of verdicts in criminal cases

#### Unit 4- Crime and Punishment (Exam)

This unit will develop understanding of the awareness of criminality, criminological theories and the process of bringing an accused to court in order to evaluate the effectiveness of social control to deliver criminal justice policy

## **Entry Requirements**

There is no prescribed prior knowledge required for this qualification. However, it is recommended that students have achieved a level 4 or above in GCSE English.

# What will this course prepare me for?
