We are delighted to share with you the fantastic results our students have achieved at both Key Stage 5 and Key Stage 4.

A Level/Key stage 5 Results

Nearly half of all our A Level grades were A*-B.

Almost 80% of all KS5 grades were A*-C or equivalent and 100% of our students achieved A*-E. These figures are both significantly above the National Average. The vast majority of our students secured their first choice and course of university and we look forward to following their bright futures.

GCSE/ Key stage 4 Results

Almost three quarters of GCSE grades were Grade 9-4, and almost a quarter were Grade 7-9, both of which are above the National Average. We are incredibly proud of all of our students and wish them lots of luck in their next steps, whether that be Sixth Form, College, Apprenticeships, University or the world of work. In the final week of term, 50 of our GCSE and A Level Drama, Music and Art students ventured to London for 24 hours of sightseeing, culture and art.
