Ask your child to choose a sports person (or other person of interest) they admire. Get them to write a list of questions they would like to ask them. They could answer in role as their hero. Ensure your child uses a range of question words.	Retell the story of a traditional tail e.g. The three billy goats gruff. Remember to use direct speech but you are not allowed to use the word "said"! Try and use exciting and interesting vocabulary.	Your mission is to document and observe the world around you as if you've never seen it before. Take notes. Collect things you find on your travels. Document your findings. Notice patterns. Focus on one thing at a time.  Record what your are drawn to.
