 2D Shapes Practise the names of the 2D shapes - square, rectangle, circle and triangle. What do they look like? How many sides? Etc. 2D Shape Hunt - What shapes can you see around your home or in the garden? (E.g. A window is a rectangle.) Draw and label these objects in your home learning books. Glue and stick activity: Make a shape picture Find a biscuit recipe to make. Cut the dough into different shapes. How many different shaped biscuits can you make? Make a castle using junk/recycle materials. How many shapes can you spot? Watch 'Mr Maker' and paint your favourite shape.  Counting (Animals & Minibeasts themed) Bunny hop pencil control activity Sing "1,2,3,4,5 - Once I caught a fish alive!" Minibeast colour by number (1-5) Read "A Squash and a Squeeze!" <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PkdX73Onf04</u> count the animals who go into the house. How many go in altogether? 	 A Squash and a Squeeze! By Julia Donaldson Listen to your parents reading the story or watch this video clip: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PkdX73Onf04 What did you enjoy in the story? Who is the main character? Can you join in this time as your parent reads it with the repeating part of the story? Write down the sentence which is being repeated. Make a story map to help your child retell the story. These are pictures drawn in order and may include words which act

 Count how many teddies can you squeeze into your bed across the pillow. Can you paint a picture of the teddies having a sleep in your bed? How many sticks can you find in the garden? Count them. Practise writing the number. (Support your child by writing the number in yellow for them to trace over with a pencil, if needed.) Can you use the sticks to construct a picture/sculpture? What can you make - a stick man/a house/a rocket/a star/etc? Can you find a story about what you've made and read it? 	 as a prompt when retelling. (I know this is a strategy that Miss Hearn has used in class. It could be on large paper/a roll of wallpaper and they walk over the pictures as they retell the story.) In your house, test to see which items you can squash or squeeze and which you cannot. Make a list of the items in each list.
 Sorting Can you sort your plastic toys into colours? How many blue [or other coloured] toys have you got? Practise writing the number for that number of times, e.g. if 5 blue toys, write 5 five times (parental support may be needed). Can you sort your books into small, medium and large? How many of each group do you have? Sort your family into groups using one category, e.g. blue eyes - brown eyes; blonde hair - brown hair. Sort your toys by how they feel - hard/soft; etc. Toys Home Learning Challenge - see separate sheet 	 Postman Bear by Julia Donaldson Listen to your parents reading the story or watch the video clip: https://youtu.be/F1u_yq7i1U8 Try answering some of the questions in the clip, e.g. what's inside the oven? (before lifting the flap to reveal the picture.) Did you enjoy the story? What did you like? When is your birthday? What did you do on your last birthday? Who came to visit you? What presents did you get? Have you had a lockdown birthday? What was special about it? Can you draw a picture of your ideal birthday party? Label the people and items. Can you design and make a birthday card/special card for a friend or family member? Make a special cake recipe to share with your family. Can you send a card/postcard through the post to someone? Write a message inside the card.

Additional Activities:

- Share stories and write down a sentence about each story.
- Maths activity sheets see separate sheets.
