


Year 4 Spring 2

This half term your homework is to practise our weekly spellings, and read to an adult 4 times a week.



Once an activity is complete, the children will share it with the class.



Learn to recite the Lord's Prayer and Hail Mary.

Learn a new times table and corresponding division facts, answer questions about it and be able to recite this to the class teacher.

To learn how to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes (analogue clock)

Create a piece of artwork linked to Spring and new Life.

Write a book review about a book you have completed. (Sheets in class for this)

Make a poster or powerpoint explaining how to tell the time.

Make a poster to promote recycling in school.

Complete a mini-project on how to keep our teeth healthy. This could be a model with labels or presentation

Write or draw the Easter story.
This could be a comic strip or short story.

This homework has been designed to allow the children to learn more about their topic. The children are able to complete their work in any way they would like i.e. they may want to create a PowerPoint, they may want to take pictures with annotations under them or they may choose to write a fact file on lined paper, it is totally up to them- the more creative the better! The work will be displayed in the classroom and children will have a chance to speak to their peers about their chosen activity. A log will be kept of who is completing homework tasks.

Spellings are tested each Tuesday morning, please encourage your child to practise their spellings at home. Please note, theses spellings are a recap of previous years. Each week, 20 spellings will be tested. 15 from this week, plus 5 from the previous weeks. This is to ensure they are being remembered from week to week. If they are learning the red words only, 15 spellings will be tested. 10 from this week and 5 from the previous weeks.

Please keep these spellings safe but if you do misplace them they are on the school app and website.
